Coaches Corner

My name is Andy Sellers and I am the Head coach here at Kettering Hockey Club. My main role is to oversee all the coaching that goes on at the club and ensure that we are all working hard to offer our club members the highest quality coaching using up to date methods and resources working closely with England and GB hockey. In this section of the newsletter you will have the opportunity to meet the coaches and find out more about them, be provided with little bits of coaching advice from our coaches and generally help develop your hockey knowledge further. This month we are looking at what makes the ultimate hockey player and also some information about the 'golden thread'

What makes the ultimate hockey player?

The 'Player' refers to the individual athlete and the personal (physiological, psychological, social and emotional) qualities required to achieve the 'End in Mind' characteristics and deliver when it matters - both on and off the pitch. GB Hockey has identified nine interacting and connected qualities that sit at the heart of a player's hockey DNA, and vital for GB Hockey 'Player" to achieve the 'End in Mind'.

Personal Qualities of a hockey player

These are the 9 characteristics we look to develop in our young players here at KHC;

- 1. Fast Player is able to demonstrate the necessary speed of body and/or mind to compete in a fast dynamic game
- 2. **Physically, Mentally & Emotionally Durable -** Player is able to regularly perform over time, in training and competition, when needed, without injury
- 3. **Physically Literate -** Player is able to demonstrate the basic fundamental physical movement skills to be able to perform increasingly complex hockey specific skills
- 4. **Intelligent Trainers -** Player can effectively adapt, manage and optimise physical preparation and recovery to meet specific performance needs when away from the GB/HC environment
- 5. **Self Managers -** Player is able demonstrate resourcefulness in managing time and tasks, and in balancing hockey life and home life.
- 6. Motivated and Driven Player is clear on what they want to do, how to do it, and is prepared to do what it takes
- 7. **Able to Cope with Pressure -** Player is able to demonstrate a range of mental qualities and techniques consistent with elite performance at the required moment
- 8. **Self-Aware Learners -** Player is able to demonstrate good self-awareness, realistically reflect on own performance, engage in purposeful practice, and access appropriate support from others
- 9. **Able to Work With Others -** Player is able to communicate effectively, relate to others, and demonstrate appropriate leadership

The Golden Thread

As well as developing these qualities in our players we are also working on implementing 'the golden thread'. These are the main fundamental aspects we wish to see in our coaching sessions across all age groups. Our coaches will be ensuring that when planning sessions that these principles are at the heart of their session.



The most effective way of developing highly skilled players, keeping players coming back to our sessions and delivering fun and engaging sessions is through fun, game-like activities rather than repetitive drills. Games or game-like activity should be an essential focus of each session, rather than just played at the end. At Kettering we often start our junior sessions with games and game related activities ensuring that all children are engaged and challenged from the word go.

Kettering JUNIOR ACADEMY

Junior training will start on the 10th Sep and all our coaches are looking forward to starting the new season. We have an additional training session for U8's called Hockey Heroes, aimed at young children who haven't played hockey before. This programme is a 6 week block of sessions where players can transition to the main U8's team if they wish to.

The key focus of the Junior Academy is to help our young players and coaches develop confidence and maximise their potential on the field. To continue the success of the Academy over recent years we will be applying a more structured approach to our coaching team development and adding a 'Coaching Hub' to our website where senior and junior coaches can locate materials to support their sessions planning. There has been a lot of work going on behind the scenes since the end of last season to help build links with primary schools, secondary schools and other junior teams within the county. Our aim is to provide more fixtures for all junior teams this season and also increase numbers of players to enable us to do this. Many of Becky's former team mates at R&D are now club members at Kettering. Becky initially had cervical cancer and was thought to be in remission but sadly the cancer returned and she was unable to respond to treatment. Becky was 29 years old when she died last year.
