Well, what a year it has been!

It has been my pleasure to be part of the most successful 1st team squad in many years, and also to note all the efforts made by everybody to promote the club, not just from a playing perspective. The club is now scored far more highly for its hospitality and behaviour than it has in recent memory, the Vets continue to go from strength to strength to not only make friends, but also attract more players to the club (both new and returning!), and of course, there are the FANTASTIC achievements of the Junior section.

Coaching has been well attended by the Ladies – and it would be great to see the Men's section mirroring the Ladies commitment! Informal Social events have continued to bond the club further, with the Men's and Ladies' sections now more closely linked than I can ever remember. Whilst the Ladies have not quite matched the Men's 1st team, they have had very encouraging seasons, with both teams finishing only a few wins away from promotion places.

So, what does the future hold?

Well, local clubs continue to look enviously at the Sils, and whilst neither of the two recently talked about mergers have come to anything, that does not mean the club is in a bad position – membership numbers are increasing, our coaching structure is getting more and more established, success is coming on the pitch, and the club finances and facilities continue to get better and better. Our online presence continues to improve as well, with the club website appearing in the top 3 on Google, Bing and Yahoo if you type in "Solihull Hockey Club", and also the development of a new online portal for buying club merchandise – check out www.Silz.co.uk, and you will see that we are setting up the facility to order kit online that can be paid for, and delivered to the club for collection from behind the bar.

The club this year has been re-accredited with the Clubs First accreditation (the first club in the County to be re-accredited, so we continue to provide the direction for all other clubs to follow in the area), the Sils provides more coaching and support to the County than any other club, and we have also made some ground-breaking progress with the schools in North Solihull, providing QuickSticks coaching and getting over 100 kids involved in hockey who had never played before. Off the back of all this, the club has been nominated as one of the shortlisted clubs for England Hockey's Club of the Year – fingers crossed we can make it to the last 3!!

As always, as we look towards next season, the club is keen to hear from anyone who is happy to help out. REMEMBER, there are all sorts of different roles that do not necessarily require a huge amount of work, nor time, but would make a huge difference to the 5 or 6 members of the club who currently do EVERYTHING!

We are keen to promote the development of our Juniors next year, so assistance with Vixens, Badgers and U14 / 16 / 18 teams would be great. Also, remember that the club is happy to pay for you to get any coaching or umpiring qualifications, so please don't let that put you off!

The Silz Festival
