(WIKI) Seaford Town was first founded in 1888 as Seaford FC allegedly succeeding the first competitive Seaford club, the Seaford Rovers FC. who were founded around 1882. In 1910 Seaford FC won the Sussex Junior Cup. Like all Sussex clubs they didn't play any games during The first world war and part of their pitch was dug up to grow food.

After the Great War, Seaford FC played in the Mid Sussex League and won the Montgomery Cup in 1936 and 1939, but again the club had to stop playing games due to another World War.

After the Second World War, they were among the founding members of the Sussex County League Division Two in 1952.

They won promotion to Division One in the 1963–64 season and were an ever-present in the top division until being relegated in 1971. During that period they achieved their highest ever league position – 4th place in 1965–66.

The club left the County League in 1978 but rejoined as of the founder members of the new Division Three in 1983. Seaford Town won Division Three in 1985–86 and followed up this success with winning the Division Two title in 1988–89 earning promotion back to the top flight. This spell in Division One only lasted two seasons before they were relegated back in 1991 after finishing 17th. Further relegations followed in 1992–93 and in 1996–97 which saw the club leaving the Sussex County League altogether.

After two seasons in the East Sussex League, they regained their County League status and also changed their name to just Seaford as opposed to 'Seaford Town' as they merged with the youth sides Seaford Seagulls which had teams ranging from under 7s all the way through to under 16s. This saw Seaford change from their traditional all red strip, to a red shirt with blue sleeves and blue shorts. Seaford was changed back to Seaford Town in 2005.

Seaford were promoted to Division Two in 2000–01 where they have been ever since, with 5th being their best finish achieved in 2010–11.

Oakwood travelled to Seaford Town on the Saturday after a poor performance against Wick & Barnham United in the Division Two Challenge Cup. Oaks were without a few key players for this tough away fixture and had only played one league match this year so were expected to be rusty and slow to get into the game.

Oaks started with a 4-3-3 formation looking to go home with a win against the bottom of the league opposition, although it wasn't going to be a breeze. Oaks started with an urgency and endeavour creating chances in the 1st minute and in the 2nd they had scored through Dean Lovegrove's persistence, chasing down the defender coming out the victor of a 50/50 challenge seeing him with the goal in his cross hairs, he placed the ball past the keeper with relative ease. The second goal came only 10 mins after the first with a great little pass between Clive Piller and Toby Gilbert, losing his marker and the goal opened up for Piller to hit the back of the net with a placed side foot shot.

On the 18th min a cross was delivered across the box for the midfield duo of Piller and Miller to create the third. Piller un-selfishly controlled the cross and brought the ball down into the path of the on-coming Miller to fire the ball in to the bottom corner for the Oaks to take a commanding lead. Although the Oaks were three up they certainly weren't firing on all cylinders and frustration started to play a part, the team were over playing and complicating a game that they could have sealed in the first half. Half time came and Oaks were 3–0 up and had chances to go further ahead and were lucky the home team had hit the woodwork three times in the opening half.

The second half started with the same vigour from Oakwood but this time they were out playing Seaford and making it hard for them to get possession. Seaford you could see were struggling to keep up with the slick second half performance. Oakwood were knocking the ball around quickly and with confidence probing the Seaford fullback at every occasion. Seaford had conceded their fourth within 10 minutes of the restart with a venomous shot from Toby Gilbert deflecting over the keeper and nestling the back of the net. The fifth was long in coming and Gerald Manville notched up another goal in his Oakwood tally.

Seaford looked defeated and their frustrations were building with physical challenges being made all over the park. Oakwood were now playing really well and continued to press and create opportunity after opportunity. It was a one sided half with Jesse Grimstone only touching the ball twice with pass backs from the defenders. In the 85th minute the final Oakwood goal came from a lovely piece of two touch play working the ball across to the right hand wing and Darren Tidey lofted a cross to the back post for Gilbert nod past the challenging keeper for his second of the game.
