

Longlevens AFC

Risk Assessment August 2020



These guidelines have been produced in line with the Government guidance as of and including 1st August 2020.

Anyone who is deemed vulnerable in respect of Covid-19 and/or showing signs of symptoms is reminded to follow the Government's guidance and should only return to football when it is right for them to do so.

Self-checks will be important to prevent transmission among people who are unaware that they are carriers of the virus. If you display any symptoms of Covid-19 do not attend the premises or playing field.

Key controls include are – Promoting Good Hygiene / Keep Facilities Clean / Maintaining Social Distancing and Avoid Congestion / NHS Test and Trace / Travel.

Volunteers, players and supporters (inc. but not limited to, Covid-19 Self-Assessment, NHS Test and Trace, Safety Briefings)	Risk of contracting Covid-19 from infected surfaces and people	Before arrival at Club all participants (players volunteers, match officials and spectators) should check for symptoms, in line with current Government guidance If symptomatic or living in a household with possible Covid-19 infection should remain home. Club to support NHS Test and Trace efforts by collecting name and contact information of all participants at both training and matches Safety briefings to be carried out before any competitive training or matches (following FA Code of Behaviour) by manager/Covid-19 officer Volunteers will be required to clean surfaces infected by people carrying the virus Deep clean premises if someone fall ill with Covid-19 on the premises	Volunteers and players will need to be warned immediately if someone is tested positive for Covid-19 and has been on the premises or playing field

Car park and travel from club	Social distancing is not observed as people congregate before entering, after matches and travelling in cars to and from matches	Players will be asked not to congregate in the car park in large groups. If players congregating, they need to meet on field and maintain social distancing measures/limit groups. Where possible leave gaps between cars parking and respect each other No car sharing when arriving to and from the venue with anyone other than your household or support bubble Where players travel with people outside household or support bubble should follow best practice namely share transport with same people, open windows, clean vehicle (door handles) before and after, wear face coverings and face away from each other CLUB COVID-19 OFFICER OVERSEES ALL ACTIONS ON MATCHDAY OR TRAINING SESSIONS	Outside areas are less risky, the mai risk is likely to be where people congregate and travel in vehicles

Risk of contracting Covid-19 from infected surfaces Large groups of people in one area Cleaning standards not maintained	Additional hand sanitising stations will be provided At till point players, volunteers and supporters will be encouraged to make contactless payments to avoid handling money One-way system in place to deter congregation at bar and includes NHS test and trace register to obtain all details. No service until register completed Players, volunteers and spectators will be encouraged to either leave bar through one-way system or to sit in	Seating has been spread out and in some areas restricted in order for safe social distancing measures to take place. One-way system to encourage drinks to be taken outside where possible.

Changing rooms and showers including match officials changing room	Restricted access to ensure that safety guidelines can be met	Limited use of facilities. A maximum of 4 people in each of the changing rooms at one time, limited to up to 8 in the showers at one time. Where possible, players and match officials must arrive changed and shower at home Clear signage will be displayed on the doors to notify users Before players and match officials visit, they will be made aware that this facility will be unavailable for use CLUB COVID-19 OFFICER OVERSEES ALL ACTIONS ON MATCHDAY OR TRAINING SESSIONS	Notices to be displayed advising not in use

Toilets	Risk of contracting Covid-19 from infecting surfaces Cleaning standards not maintained	There will be a hand sanitising station outside the toilets and users will be asked to sanitise before and after entry – extra washing materials inside Only one person will be allowed in the toilets at any one time Toilets will be open pre-match (and training), during the match and afterward Toilets will be regularly checked to maintain cleanliness CLUB COVID-19 OFFICER OVERSEES ALL ACTIONS ON MATCHDAY OR TRAINING SESSIONS	Ensure soap, paper towels, tissues and toilet paper are regularly replenished Notices to be displayed advising only person in toilet at any one time
Equipment including ball transfer and kit washing	Risk of contracting Covid-19 from sharing equipment Risk of spreading virus through equipment being touched by more than one person	Pre-match handshakes should not happen, instead players will be asked to hand sanitise before kicking off The sharing of equipment should be avoided where possible	Hand sanitise station and ball disinfected solution available on touchline (spray units made available)

Social distancing not being always observed	When shared thoroughly washed/ disinfected regularly Ball out of play should not be retrieved by non-participants with use of feet, plus disinfecting when break in play Where equipment is handled by more than one person, they should wash their hands immediately afterwards Participants should bring with them their own named water bottle and must not share drinks with other players The placement of these should be dispersed to avoid groups of players coming together Players should take their kit home to wash themselves, rather than one person handling a large quantity of soiled materials Goalposts, nets and corner flags to be disinfected prior, midway through and end of game maintaining cleanliness All training equipment is sanitised after every weekly session CLUB COVID-19 OFFICER OVERSEES ALL ACTIONS ON MATCHDAY OR TRAINING SESSIONS	It should be clear whose responsibility it is to clean all equipment after use

General First aid	Risk of contracting Covid-19 when a member or player requires first aid	If there is first-aider or other medical personnel present they should be equipped with appropriate PPE to protect themselves and others if they need to compromise social distancing guidelines to provide medical assistance CLUB COVID-19 OFFICERS OVERSEES ALL ACTIONS ON MATCHDAY OR TRAINING SESSIONS	Evaluate the situation and try to give guidance to avoid personal contact where possible
Spectators and volunteers when pitchside	Risk of contracting Covid-19 while watching competitive football Risk of contracting Covid-19 from handling equipment whilst preparing the football pitch for use	Spectators should remain socially distanced and groups must be restricted to six person gathering limits and spread out Volunteers will adhere to social distancing where possible and limit on site at any one time Personal hygiene to be maintained, sanitising equipment and hands frequently CLUB COVID-19 OFFICER OVERSEES ALL ACTIONS ON MATCHDAY OR TRAINING SESSIONS	After matches spectators must maintain social distance with social interaction in Sportsman Lounge or patio
