Waitrose Community Matters

A tremendous effort and contribution has been made by excaptain and 1st team legend Steve Campbell who volunteered with his work colleague to run the London Marathon raising funds for our M&J section. Steve Tucker also arranged with Waitrose for Northwich to be part of their Green Token scheme. A grand total of £2073 was raised for the club juniors & Northwich donated an additional £917 to the partner charity Tiny Steps.



The RFU is committed to providing the platform for more teams and players playing more matches.

Game On provides flexibility and options for clubs that do not have access to a large pool of players to play more games, more often. Based on feedback from players and with the aim of ensuring more games are played and reducing the number of cancellations, the Game On principles allow teams to be more flexible with the laws to allow the match to go ahead.

With Game On a match can now take place as long as each team has a



minimum of 10 players. In addition, the result will stand as long as the match is a minimum of 40 minutes rather than 80.

Rolling substitutions can be made and teams are encouraged to apply the Half Game rule to ensure that each player in every match day squad plays at least half of the available playing time.

The principles also allow for both scrums and lineouts to be uncontested.

Both teams must agree which of the Game On principles will apply to the match and notify the referee at least 30 minutes prior to kick off. If both teams cannot agree which principles to apply the match will proceed without the application of the Game On principles.
