ROTARY CLUB OF NORTHWICH CHARITY SWIMATHON 2019

Annually the Northwich Rotary Club organises a 50-50 charity Swimathon at the Memorial Court Pool, Northwich. (50% to Rotary chosen charities, 50% of your teams raised Sponsorship to your chosen charity ie NRUFC). This year they are hoping for a bigger and better event, with more people joining the fun on 23rd & 24th March and, ultimately, more money raised for the chosen charities.



The event is for swimmers of all ages and abilities, although it is not a race. This year they have invited Northwich RUFC to enter teams of around six swimmers, who then ask friends, relations and work colleagues to sponsor them. Each team has a 55-minute slot but only one member of each team swims at once so there is no need for any one individual to swim for the whole 55 minutes. Team members usually take it in turns to swim a length each. All sponsorship is based on the team total of lengths. Light refreshments are provided for all swimmers after their swim and each is given a team photograph, a certificate showing the number of lengths swum by the team and a memento of the event showing that they've participated in the charity Swimathon.
