Members Covid Guidance - April 2021

- This guidance is for our Members and visitors and is in line with ECB Guidelines for organised cricket in England at Step 2 of the Government Roadmap out of Lockdown from 12 April 2021. For details of the full guidance contact the Committee
- Please remember to do a personal symptom check at home prior to any matches, training or if you plan to visit the Club. Stay at home and do not take part if you have any COVID-19 symptoms. Members should let the Club know if you have been tested for Covid 19
- The use of the Clubhouse is restricted under the current Rules. There will be no access other than for use of the toilet facilities. Changing rooms must remain closed except for disabled persons and emergency requirements. Participants should arrive in their kit ready to play and should return home in their kit
- There is a legal requirement to record participant and attendee contact details for the purposes of NHS Test and Trace. Please sign in using the NHS QR Code or signing in sheet provided at the club entrance.
- The Kitchen will be out of action. As a hospitality venue are permitted to serve food and beverage to customers outdoors in accordance with government COVID guidance for restaurants and bars. You will be able to sit outside the clubhouse at a table and order drinks
- We will be operating a one way system for the toilets. Access to male will be through the away changing rooms exiting via the club room through the kitchen. Access to the ladies toilet will be through the Home changing rooms exiting via the club room through the kitchen. Please use card payments
- We have re-arranged the seating/benches outside of the clubhouse to create some space to keep the entrance clear. Please do not move the benches or use your own seating in this area.
- The scorer's table has been moved next to the scoreboard. Please do not sit in this area
 or move the tables
- Spectators are not currently permitted at Step 2. This does not apply to carers for people with disabilities, adults needed to supervise under-18s in a safeguarding role or patrons attending the venue for hospitality.
- Off the field, social distancing guidelines and legal gathering size limits must be observed at Step 2 this means the Rule of 6 or a group made up of two households (a group made up of two households can include more than 6 people, but only where all members of the group are from the same two households (or support/childcare bubbles, where eligible)).
