New Tech!

We now have a new system put in place run by a company called "Bespoke Scoreboards" You can see some of their work at www.bespokescoreboards.co.uk

The external appearance of the scoreboard is virtually the same as before, the only changes are a new panel for "DLS Par" score and a built in Umpires light. The control box is however new and works slightly differently to our old control box. For those who ay be involved in scoring it is fairly simple to use and with five minutes practice I'm sure you will all get the hang of it. As with the old unit, we can operate it from the scorebox or the pavilion. It can



be plugged it, or if fully charged will run for 10 hours without being plugged in. It can operate on it's own (as our current system) and can also work with other technology.

For those using laptops there is a cable to connect to a small box which will transfer the details from your laptop direct to the scoreboard – without having to use the control box at all. A new feature is that those that score on tablets or on their phone can transmit via Bluetooth direct to the scoreboard – so, for example, if someone is scoring a Juniors game on their phone then they can automatically update the scoreboard as they enter the details on their phone. It can cater for pairs cricket as well.
