

<p><b>1974</b></p> <p><b>Waverley used nine bowlers</b></p> <p>Farncombe 11 drew with Waverley. Burchett and Morton gave Waverley a good start with 48 for the first wicket, and Bower and Morton added a further 77 for the second wicket. Morton went on to complete an excellent 73 in just over two hours. Farncombe made a disastrous start against Kirkpatrick and Powell and were six wickets down for 17 runs. Thursley won the toss and elected to bat but runs came slowly against tight bowling by Kirkpatrick and Day. Only Taylor and Staves showed any confidence on the damp wicket and the side got out for 104, Day grabbing six wickets for his season's-best figures. Waverley can thank a fine all-round performance by Tony Day for this victory. Brookwood lost their first wicket at 5 but Greenway and Anns took the score to 70 before Day joined the attack, and with useful support from Morton, restricted the total to 140, Day ending with figures of 6-41 in 13 overs. Waverley lost 3 wickets for 19 before Geldert stayed with Day to add 58 valuable runs for the fourth wicket. Day then cut loose and when he was out for a magnificent 87, including two 6's and twelve 4's, only 18 runs were needed. Puttenham started badly and lost 3 wickets for 14 runs, but good innings from Ashdown and White enabled to recover and reach the respectable total of 126. When the visitors replied Phil Burchett was again in splendid form and with their score at 89-3 they looked well placed for victory. After being put in to bat, Waverley lost their first wicket at 4, but Harrington and Dexter batted sensibly to add 97 for the second wicket. After Harrington had been dismissed for a fine 57, Harland helped Dexter take the score to 163 without further loss. Medstead lost four wickets for 47, all to Powell, before Potter began to open out and swing the game in his side's favour. He made a fine 75, including three 6's and eight 4's.
