Bowdon RUFC Mini and Junior Section Subscriptions

REGISTRATION AND TRAINING

Please make sure that your child brings a towel, track suit or clean clothes and trainers to change into after the match or training session. We do not allow dirty kit to be worn in the club house or bar.

Home Games

It is important that parents read the following information regarding dropping off and pick up of your child / children. On a Sunday morning if we are playing or training at home it is the parent's responsibility to sign their child in and out of the club. Most age groups will take a roll at the beginning of every training session. After training, there will be a short trophy presentation for 'player/s of the week' and any messages to parents will also be communicated. The roll will again be taken to ensure all children are present. All the kids, will then be escorted to the club house where they will be given a hot dog and drink. Your child will be available to collect from the club at 12 Noon.

We encourage volunteer participation wherever possible and would encourage parents to volunteer in any way they feel they could help. All minis teams (U7- U11) will be entered into a number of tournaments including the Cheshire Cup, Manchester Festival and Wilmslow Festival. COMMUNICATION

All communication regarding mini and junior rugby will be done via Bowdon Rugby RUFC Pitchero website, which all parents should be signed up to. Please ask your team manager if you need help with this.

To assist all club volunteers if you are asked for information please return this within the time frame requested. This will make everyone's jobs a little easier

VOLUNTEERS

The club is run on an entirely voluntary basis. In order that we can provide facilities to promote community based Rugby we need volunteers covering a wide range of abilities.

If you are prepared to help out in any way be that from helping out in the Kit Shop or agreeing to be Secretary for the Mini and Junior section just let your child's coach know (remember Grandparents can help out as well!)

CLUB SHOP

We are awaiting the imminent arrival of our new club shop, which will be sited immediately to the front of the main clubhouse patio.

The shop will stock an array of essential training and match day kit together with a selection of bespoke leisure wear for players and supporters alike. A full stock list and price list will be on display in the shop.

The shop is a commercial enterprise but will offer competitive prices on all stock and will be open for business on certain evenings in the week (to coincide with mid-week training) and every Sunday morning throughout the season.

LOST PROPERTY

You would be amazed at the amount of lost property that develops over the season.

The M&Js have a box located in the changing room corridor that all lost property is placed in. The box is clearly marked and this should be your first point of call if any kit goes missing. Lost Property is cleared periodically, with unclaimed items being sent to a charity shop.

If not in the container then ask your year team manager as coaches may have picked the items up and placed them in their Age Group Kit Bag.

At the end of the season all unclaimed lost property is washed and sent to a local Charity shop.

Boot Exchange

We appreciate our kids are growing up rapidly and rugby/football boots are expensive so we have a simple policy that if you have a pair of boots that no longer fit then place them (after they've been cleaned off) in the Boot Exchange Box (next to Lost Property) and if there is a pair in there that fit, then please help yourself .

FIRST AID

The club has a First Aid Board located on the exterior of the building overlooking the 1st Team pitch.

On Sunday mornings the Board will display who and where the nominated First Aiders are located on site and their contact details.

There will also be a First Aid Kit and a Defibrillator hanging on the sign.

If the Defibrillator is required then please do not hesitate BUT follow the instructions on the machine – it has been designed to be used without training so has a simple Step by Step guide.

Additional First Aid Kits are distributed to the Coaches for each age group.

SAFETY is of paramount concern to us at the club.

There are a few things we would appreciate your assurance on. Please ensure that boots have the correct kite marked RUGBY studs fitted (if you are not sure you have the correct studs ask your coach). Incorrect studs will render a player ineligible to train or play. Studs can be purchased from all good sports outlets.

Gum Shields - it is strongly recommended that these are worn at all times during matches and whilst training for the Under 9's and upwards.

Head gear/Scrum Caps – Head injuries are rare in Mini and Juniors rugby but obviously can occur and the club (like the RFU) take this matter extremely seriously.

We have reviewed available medical research on the effectiveness of wearing “well fitted” scrum caps and as yet there is no empirical evidence that the use of scrum caps reduces the incidence of concussion in contact to the head. Should evidence become available to the contrary we will take advice from the RFU and review the club's policy on headgear. Scrum caps do however protect the head from cuts, bruises and cauliflower ear!

The current stance at BRUFC is that the wearing of headgear is a “parent & player” choice and if you do choose then please ensure the headgear is fitted properly and secure.

CONCUSSION

Should any player receive a knock to the head and appear in any way concussed then the coach will immediately remove the player from the situation and seek assistance from one of the club's first aiders.

Parents/guardians will be informed of the incident after training and an official note will be made in the club's medical register.

If diagnosed as suffering from concussion that player **WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO TRAIN OR PLAY FOR 6 WEEKS. Please consult your GP.**

It is vitally important that should any player leave the club feeling in any way concussed then the parent/guardian inform their coach/team manager so the appropriate timescales for full rehabilitation can be enforced.

MEDICATION, if your child needs to take regular medication (for example inhalers to treat asthma), please ensure they bring it with them if they need it. Coaches cannot be held responsible for administering any form of medication, but please notify them of any medical condition or otherwise that you think may have an impact on their training and participation in playing.

CATERING & BAR

As was the case last season, catering will be available on Sunday mornings. Bowdon RUFC will provide each child that trains or plays in a match with a free Hot Dog (or equivalent).

SUBSCRIPTIONS

Please complete your Direct Debit Mandate form on the day of registration or complete and return the week after. **If this has not been completed it will invalidate any insurances that the club has in place.** It is in the interests of all to ensure that they are set up straight away.

Please note, that if necessary, the club committee has the discretion to lower the subscription rate for persons who need assistance, in such cases please contact the lead coach for the age group.

This is inline with the aims of the club to promote youth rugby within our local area.

HIRE OF CLUB HOUSE/GROUND

The bar and main function room is available for hire for Birthdays, Christenings and other occasions. The room can hold up to 200 people seated and is an excellent place to celebrate that special occasion. A discount will be given to all Mini and Junior members who wish to hire it.

Child Protection Policy

The following procedures and guidelines have been adopted by Bowdon RUFC.

They have been adopted for three main reasons:

1. To ensure the safety of children and good practice of club operations.
2. To protect the interests of club members and coaches.
3. To comply with the requirements of The Children Act. (The Children Act (1989) became law in October 1991, and is a major piece of legislation affecting children, their parents and those who work with children).

Procedures and Guidelines

- The club has appointed a Child Protection Officer
- Only recognised coaches/volunteers and recognised/authorised visitors/parents/guardians will be permitted on site during training sessions/matches.
- Only officially appointed Minis/Junior Coaches will be permitted to control Bowdon RUFC activities whilst adhering to the following guidelines:
 1. Be professional and maintain the highest standards of personal behaviour at all times.
 2. Be aware of situations, which can be misconstrued or manipulated by others. For example, if the coach or official is alone with a child in the clubhouse, changing rooms or similar place, they are open to the possibility of allegations about their behaviour.
 3. Be vigilant and aware, of how actions can be misinterpreted.
 4. Not to appear to favour or show interest in one child more than another.
 5. Be very aware that physically handling a player, perhaps to help develop a game skill such as the tackle, scrum ruck or maul, can be misconstrued by an observer or even by the player.
 6. Never swear or use or respond to sexual innuendo.
 7. Design and use training methods and training programmes, which are wholly appropriate to the individual player.
 8. Ensure that, as far as possible, they are not alone when working with young players on an individual basis. If this is unavoidable then the parents should be made aware of the situation for the sake of the coach or official. This also means that children should not be alone in cars or homes with a coach/official on a regular basis. The presence of others is an insurance against false accusations.
 9. Conduct all dealings with children in a public environment in full view of others, in order that all behaviour can be observed.

10. On tours/trips away from home, ensure that another adult is always present when working with children. For example, another adult should always be present if a Child's room is visited at any time and the door should always be left open.
 11. Report any concerns within the area of Child Protection (physical, emotional, sexual or neglect), in confidence and without delay, to the Child Protection Officer or a responsible person who can give advice and recommend any necessary action.
 12. Not, at any time, discuss an allegation or suspicion with another person, other than the police, before either the above person or a responsible person has been contacted.
 13. When reporting an allegation or suspicion, record information, including relevant details (This includes the nature of the allegation, background information of the parties involved, the period of time to which the allegation relates and the degree to which the information is known to be fact rather than opinion or hearsay).
 14. At no time make comment to the media. The RFU Press Office should be made aware of any media interest in relation to child protection.
- All children under 8 years of age must be accompanied by a parent/guardian when arriving and leaving the Club unless written agreement is provided otherwise beforehand.
 - Every child must be checked in on the register when arriving.
 - No child is permitted to leave the site without parental consent during coaching sessions.
 - Children will not be released from the Club's facilities to anyone who is not recognised as the official collector of the child.
 - Equipment shall be suitable, child centred, and in good repair.
 - Accurate records shall be properly maintained for each child including details of names, address, telephone, emergency contact, details of health and necessary confidential notes.
 - Any personal details/information about any child will be kept completely confidential by the staff having access to it.
 - Details of all coaches/volunteers will also be kept on record.
 - All coaches/relevant volunteers will be checked by the Criminal Records Bureau.

Child Protection

As the provider of mini/junior coaching sessions and games all of our members and coaches have a duty of care to protect all children under their supervision from possible cases or causes of abuse.

Our members' and coaches main role in the protection of children will be:

- To be aware of the symptoms children may display if suffering from any form of abuse.
- To report any suspicion they may have about possible cases of abuse.

Child Sickness/Injury

If a child becomes unwell or is injured whilst under the supervision of the Club and it is the appropriate coach/relevant first aider's judgement that it is to that child's detriment to stay on site, the following procedure will be adopted:

- The child will be removed from activities that are likely to deteriorate their state of health.
- The relevant coach/first aider will contact the relevant parent/guardian
- The relevant coach/first aider will record all information about the incident on the Incident/Accident Report Form
- If the parent/guardian cannot be reached the relevant coach/first aider will ensure that the child is supervised until the parent/guardian can be reached.

Children Taking Medication:

- Children who take medication, of any nature, will be responsible for administering it themselves.
- Under no circumstances will any club member/coach accept responsibility for securing or administering a child's medication.
- Any medication that a child brings to the club must be labelled with the child's name.

Although these are 'rules' club members and coaching staff will be encouraged to use their common sense and decide when it would be appropriate to handle medication, e.g. a coach may hold medication such as inhalers while a child participates in physical rugby activities.

POLICY STATEMENT RELATING TO THE USE OF VIDEO/PHOTOGRAPHIC IMAGES

Bowdon RUFC recognises the need to ensure the welfare and safety of all young people in rugby union.

As part of our commitment to ensure the safety of young people if you do not wish rugby related pictures taken of you child please inform the team coach. Any pictures used in connection with promoting the club will require the consent of the Childs parent. The club will follow the RFU guidance for the use of images of young people and will take all steps to ensure these images are used solely for the purposes they are intended, which is the promotion and celebration of the activities of Bowdon RUFC.

Anybody becoming aware that these images are being used inappropriately you should inform Bowdon RUFC's **Safeguarding Officer – Heather Hiett**.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Code of conduct for Parents/Carers

- Encourage your child to learn the rules and play within them.
- Discourage unfair play and arguing with officials.
- Help your child to recognise good performance, not just results.
- Never force your child to take part in sport.
- Set a good example by recognising fair play and applauding the good performances of all.
- Never punish or belittle a child for losing or making mistakes.
- Publicly accept officials' judgements.
- Support your child's involvement and help them to enjoy their sport.
- Use correct and proper language at all times.

Code of conduct for Junior players

- All players must play within the laws/rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All players must respect opponents.
- All players should respect the directions of coaches at all times both for their safety and the safety of others.
- Players should advise coaches/team managers of their availability for matches/training.
- Players should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Players must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Show respect for the equipment and facilities provided by the club.
- Bullying of any description (physical, verbal or emotional) is deemed by the club to be unacceptable behaviour and should be reported to the coach/team manager in order that it can be investigated and appropriate action taken.
- Junior players must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior players are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior players are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.

Junior Club Rules

Bowdon RUFC is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members. The club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with either The Chairman of the Mini and Junior section, Gareth Harris or your Head Coach.

As a member of Bowdon RUFC you are expected to abide by the following junior club rules:

- All members must play within the laws/rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect opponents.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit – Correct studs are mandatory and mouth guards are strongly recommended for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
