His outstanding performance made the whole game more inclusive for the entire team and dully earnt him a well-deserved player of the week award.

The confident quick passing made some great opportunities against well drilled Barnet team. A great performance by the whole team which deserves credit.



#### **U11 Update: Home Vs Barnet Elizabethans**

As the Datchworth U11 juggernaut kept on trucking, the team achieved on Sunday morning what unfortunately eluded England later in the day – home victory against a determined and physical opposition. Come rain or shine the U11s continue to improve week after week, concentrating on their own game, building the team spirit and calmly ignoring any outside distractions.

Barnet left the storms of North London behind and arrived at Datchworth with 18 players for 2 full strength teams, but were matched in numbers by the home side, so a closely fought encounter was anticipated. Fortunately, the rain held off for the duration of the matches, but it was incredibly wet and slippery throughout.

The first round of games were both fast paced with Datchworth proving resilient in defence and trying to be more adventurous in attack. We are encouraging the players



to try and pass a bit quicker when they are caught in contact and some progress from Thursday training was visible with our players actively looking to try and off-load to a team mate. Team spirit is also evident in our tackling, with players hunting their opponents like prey and forcing mistakes.

Both first round matches were comfortable victories for Datchworth and a change of referees for the second matches didn't help Barnet, with their players running out of enthusiasm as Datchworth pulled ahead on the scoreboard once again. On match

days such as these it's it would be useful to award 2 separate player of the week trophies, but actually that would be doubly difficult to separate the players when they all give such effort and commitment.

There were notable contributions from Tom passing to supporting runners and Zach stealing the ball from opponents multiple times. And if Eddie Jones wants to play power runners he could do worse than come and see Tommy and Henry leading by example.

However the coaches did conclude a tight decision for player of the week and awarded the trophy (match ball?) to Samuel for his all round contribution the overall team result in terms of tackling, rucking and running the length of the pitch when the opportunity opened up in front of him.



#### **U12 Update: Home Vs Barnet Elizabethans**

Another great morning of rugby at Datch this Sunday, where not only did we avoid defeat (but we don't count scores) but also avoided the majority of what felt like the Atlantic ocean falling out of the sky as we got out of our beds. Barnet were gracious enough to bring 13 players to test themselves against the mighty Datch U12s. With a very busy weekend of rugby next weekend where we go to Hertford on the Saturday night and Letchworth on the Sunday morning, we split the teams into those teams to give them practice playing as a team in a proper match. We started with the 'Letchworth team' for two quarters of 15 mins and then looked to finish with two further quarters of the 'Hertford team' to try and provide a good level of challenge and a fair number of minutes in preparation for next week's fixtures (see Important Note). Here's a summary of the two matches:

#### **Letchworth Datch Team vs Barnet:**

After a short sharp warm up, we took to the field for the first game. It was a bit of a slow start, but we eventually found our feet through strong runs by Oli and Tommy in the midfield. We started to put Barnet under pressure but struggled to find the final pass to finish the moves off. At the break, we talked about improving our decision making and also being more physical at the breakdown. After the break we really got



going. Our defence was strong which forced Barnet to kick the ball. Finlay J loved every moment of that and took great pleasure in running the ball back with purpose (so much so that he dived into the dead ball area when attempting to score after a great counter attack). This meant that we started to take control of the match and put us on the front foot. Charlie started to get good, quick ball out to the backs where Oli really took control in the midfield with more great runs. Tommy and also Kai carried on where they left off in the first half. There was also very good supporting runs from Oscar and James S, although sometimes not receiving the final pass. We ran in some good tries at the end. Plenty to work on though, especially decision making with the ball in hand and around the breakdown. All in all a great great morning's rugby.

#### **Hertford Datch Team vs Barnet:**

As the first games commenced, the team playing in the second game worked on our set up from free kicks and penalties. We practiced running a pod of three and how we supported each other in contact. Really pleased to see Fin L taking responsibility for the pod at the restart, and great to see this rewarded with a try in the corner at the end of the first half. It showed the importance of structure and knowing our roles.

Need to mention Oscar; during the second half he saw a great opportunity to come on



the outside shoulder of Bo who had sucked in the defence. The pass didn't come off but the reading of the game and energy to make

the run should be applauded.

In total, a good hour of rugby that proved our strength in depth across the squad, giving us confidence going into multiple fixtures and reminding us of the old lesson of you can't outrun a pass (get the ball out wide). Good to see James S working his magic in midfield, showing his class in tight spaces and Keiran bringing his direct strength to the game which we have missed over the last couple of weekends. Player of the Week goes to Tommy who continues to grow in confidence and skill where it's not all about running straight all the time, but good footwork that creates the cracks to smash through.





#### Next week:

Thursday training as usual: 6pm - do wear layers, to keep warm

Saturday Hertford: 6pm - 12 go to battle it out in an evening festival (bring a hat and warm clothes)

Sunday Letchworth (Away): 9:30am (TBC)

IMPORTANT NOTE - amount of rugby an U12 can play.

Due to the intensity of the game at u12s, there are limitations set out by the RFU on how much rugby an U12 player can play. These are:

- 1. Max 70mins/day (total playing time)
- 2. No more than 2 matches in 72 hours (total playing time)

Therefore players will not be able to:

- 1. Play school rugby on Saturday morning and Hertford rugby on Saturday night as the assumption is that together this would be more than 70mins/day. Do check as it's possible that the player is selected for a school and plays very little. Player will be able to:
- 2. Play Hertford on Saturday night and at Letchworth on Sunday (no more than 2 games in 72 hours). They will also be able to play school rugby on the Saturday and Letchworth on the Sunday. However, as there is cross over between these two guidance, those playing at Hertford will not be selected to start and we may have limited game time to ensure their safety and health (tired players are more likely to get injured) and everyone gets a fair run out (we don't keep scores).

So if you are playing at Hertford you are welcome to come to Letchworth, but you will not play a full 40mins (a maximum match length). I do hope that's clear.

Any head injuries picked up in a match must be reported to either Sally or one of the coaches as the player may be excluded from playing. This is part of the concussion protocols that the RFU states.

Any questions do let me know and I'll try and answer them. Our number one priority for our players since U6s is their safety.

## **Boys Youth Rugby News**

**U13 Update: Home Training** 

Today's training was all about preparing for next week's league game. We started off by warming up with some our usual handling drills, getting the boys to concentrate as much on the accuracy of their passing as the catching of the pass. We then moved on to some work on our kick offs where we can chase hard to put lots of pressure on the catcher. It was then a bit of work on simple backs move from scrums.



The next part of the session was spent in a controlled game against the Datchworth and Letchworth under 14 players not involved in their match. This turned out to be a useful training exercise that our boys definitely got a lot out of. It was good for them to really concentrate on our defensive line plus some good work on the attacking play.

A big thank you to the under 14 players for the effort they put in. It was not the nicest conditions, but all the boys really trained with great commitment.

We finished our session today by celebrating another birthday in the team. Well done Arley!

#### U14 Update: Home Vs Letchworth

A break in the rain welcomed us to Datch this Sunday, despite a somewhat waterlogged journey over. We welcomed our good friends from Letchworth for an U14 friendly, as well as forming a Baba side to play/work with Nick Broughton and our U13 squad. With a squad of 33 now, and 24 available for this fixture, being creative and seeking new ways of getting as much rugby development/match-time for all is one of our new challenges, though a welcome one for sure! The boys set themselves up in the home changing room and a playlist emerged from the speaker in there – time to get fired up! On the pitch for a good 45 min warm up, the squad's handling was looking good, with almost no dropped balls in the passing drill, and the forwards looking hungry for some contact against the bags whilst the backs practised their switch and other calls. With Steve Turley on the whistle we won the toss and elected to kick off playing downhill in the U14 game, whilst guest coach John McGinty took the Baba side with Mark (from Letchworth) to work with Nick's squad.

### U14 Friendly:

We didn't get the start we were hoping for! Letchworth received the kick, re-cycled it out wide and their winger powered over the line, but it wasn't converted (0-5). Was this a sign of a long afternoon trying to contain their fast runners? After a quick chat with the squad to remind them to both tackle and organise their defensive line, we were underway again. The squad certainly stepped up and defence became both active and better organised. There's definitely more improvement possible, but we settled into the game, and as we approached half time Koray dotted over and Luke B requested the kicking T. Coach Dave was dispatched to provide this service! Try converted, and the score then stayed at 7-5 to half time. The scrum was proving difficult at first, but our ref stepped in to straighten things up, and the Datch boys won more than they lost in this department. With the conditions damp there was plenty of practice throughout the rest of the match! With the second half approaching we picked up a knock to Alex H – a real stinger on his shin. Olly P came on into the wing with Innes to centres to see us through.

The second half was very competitive. There were some big hits and runners breaking the line, but both defences kept the score line unmoved. Louis made some great cover tackles and runs from deep. When Dom, Innes or Olly got ball in hand they



always looked dangerous. For sure there were a few handling errors for both sides, but with a wet ball and a tight game this is perhaps to be expected. Our forwards backed out of approaching the pass from Fin or Indy at real pace – a work on for Wedns for sure, but powerful and dynamic running from Henry, Koray, Duncan, Tom, Sam, Luke, Billy and Zac was good to see. Pressure from both sides and it looked like whoever snuck the next try would likely win. We were moving the ball wide well, and from one of these phases Olly P found himself powering down the right wing and scored. Not converted this time but decent effort from Luke, and the scoreline went to 12-5. The game wasn't over and the boys battled on to keep their defence together, finishing well deserved winners today!

#### U13 laws Friendly:

One of the most important parts of rugby is One Team. Individual brilliance is built on the hard work of a team, a squad, a club, and a community. Today was one of those days where Datch players in the U14s joined players from Letchworth to practice their skills and support the development of the Datch U13s in their journey in youth rugby.

After a very quick intro and focus we supported the U13s in their structure but also worked on personal improvements and battles, with the key one being intensity. Switching between attack and defence, the players came to test themselves in this area: constant press, harder contacts, stronger, smarter running, dropping any fancy stuff and keeping things super simple. Over the period of the session both Datch and Letch started to work with the physicality of 13 and 14 year olds to make real gains. forcing the U13s to think and make better decisions - exactly the training needed going into a game. At times it was stop-start to work on specific things, but overall the intensity built. It would be very difficult to call out specific players as I was impressed with everyone putting the effort in. I would, however, like to mention Noah R, who started to think better in the contact area on his aims to not just try and smash through, but think with intensity to make gains - where are the weak points, how can I make an extra yard (also be fair to say not a big fan of uncontested scrums, but then what front row is?)?. The other player would be Taylor D, who moved from passive receiver to active steam roller through controlled intensity of strength in the contact awesome stuff!

After we finished the boys went to support the 15 to cheer them to victory, knowing that it's not individuals that win, but teams, squads, and communities.

After hitting the showers (well perhaps 4 of the nearly 60 boys from both squads!) everyone tucked into the sausage and pasta surprise (we still aren't sure what the surprise is – but the kitchen staff were a super sight after a cold wet morning on the field). Player of the match was Louis, with work rate and cover from full back a key contribution today. It's fair to say that the team spirit in the changing room was awesome. Always nice to land a win, and this one was a real team effort without doubt. Dick of the day was nothing outrageous, but all the coaches agreed that we loved the way Fin pushed his counterpart in the scrum – easing him away from the tunnel. The ref noticed and fed back – he was back at it at the first scrum in the second half ... a good DotD to secure Fin!



It's been a very successful weekend for Coach Dave in particular, who scored his first ever try on Saturday, after starting to play rugby 6 years ago. Well done Coach Dave! Let's hope the 3rd XV don't have to wait another 6 years for your next one!

We go again for our next league game next Sunday, with Old Grammarians as opposition. We will need to step up again as they were probably the strongest Pool C opposition we played last season.

**U16 Update: Away Vs Cheshunt** 

Our Under 16's headed off to Cheshunt's artificial pitch for a rainy friendly this week, with a couple of our players out injured and support from a few Royston players.

Things started off fairly evenly with the play moving between the 22's for the first few minutes. We got our first try from a breakthrough their 22 from Joel who just managed to reach for the try line to score, and then a second one five minutes later again with Joel doing a great pick and go off a scrum, leaving it 0-10.



Things settled down a bit after that until half an hour in with Cheshunt almost pulled one back but had a try disallowed from a knock on, but then managed to score after a breakaway from a penalty on the half way line. Thankfully we kept piling the pressure on and got two more tries in before half time, one from forwards work with a break in the 22 from Oliver finished off by Joel crashing over again. 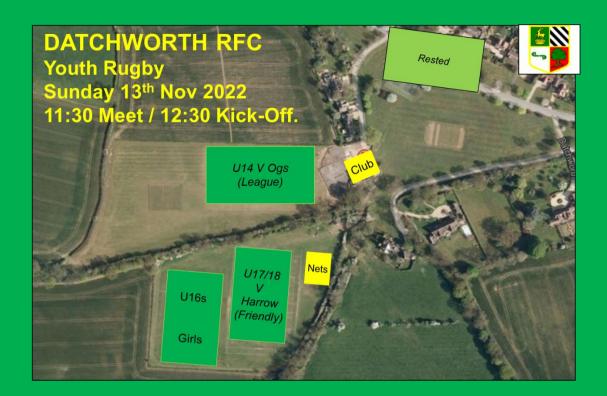
