On the playing side we must congratulate the under 14yrs boys for their win in this year's county tournament making Chard champions at this age group for the 2nd year running.

I would therefore like to present them with a Club Team of the Year Trophy in recognition of this (joint with Ladies Sunday team who have already been rewarded)

Many thanks to Andy and Gary for their work with the juniors, and to the many helpers at the Weds and Thurs sessions, and Sunday tournaments. This is vital and rewarding work, and in it lies the future of the Club. We are looking for more helpers for next season- not necessarily hockey players, so please offer your time if you can.

Training generally is under review, and the men should have been asked their views in a survey designed to gauge the best way forward with regard to participation and content, especially as significant costs are involved for coaches and pitches.

Possibly partly due to split training nights, the social side of the Club had appeared to be lacking this season. However, those who attended the end of season Presentation Night at Ilminster Bowling Club enjoyed a very sociable and fun evening, so a couple of socials in the season is all that is needed to keep us all in touch.

It has become obvious that the way we play hockey, the times we can play hockey, and the changing ways we communicate must lead us to review our players and player base. In this area we will always lose players just as they 'peak' as they head out in to the big bad world beyond Somerset. It has been ever thus. However, we must focus on retention of players, which is as (if not more important) than recruitment.

Difficulties we have to live and work with- travel distances, loss of talent to Taunton Vale, shift workers availability, injuries

Difficulties we can do something to help- communication, advising availability in advance, being prepared to play up a team when needed, welcome and encourage others, recruit friends and family as players/ umpires/helper.

We are lucky to have the support of an excellent England Hockey Area Relationship Manager. This year there is a lot of International Hockey to watch on BT Sport and live in London with the FIH Pro League matches. The season culminates with mens and ladies matches at Twickenham Stoop in June, where astroturf will be temporarily laid so that a large crowd can create an electrifying atmosphere (tickets available via EH website)

There is also a new initiative called Hockey Heroes- designed to take hockey nationwide in to primary schools in the coming year.

## b) LADIES 1ST XI
