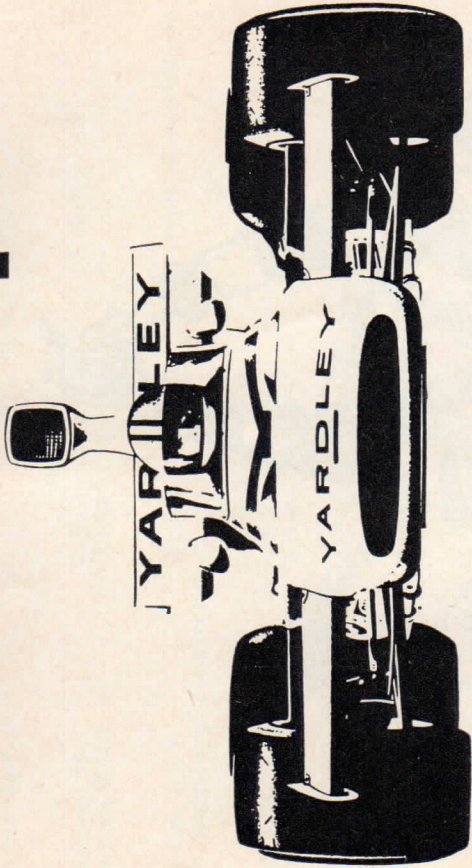

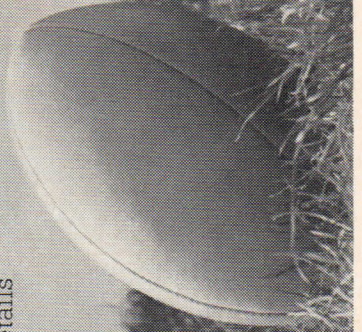

THE GUEST SIDES

GLOUCESTER

The City of Gloucester is said to be famous for its Cathedral, elvers and rugby football. Elvers are still essentially a piscatorial delicacy in the spring for those who live in the city and surrounding areas, and that is why the club and its fervent supporters are known as the "Elver-eaters". It has no relevant connection with their style, fame, success or history of rugby in the city.

Rugger in Gloucester is, indeed, virtually a religion and has been since the club was formed in 1873. It is probably the only city in England where the handling code takes complete control in the sporting world. Yet, for all their many achievements in their 100 years history—the first Rugby Union Club Champions last season—they have never "hit the headlines" as Seven-a-Side exponents. They have had their speed merchants, so to speak, and still include many players' fleet of foot.

Somehow Gloucester—the Cherry & Whites—have been most unfairly branded as perpetrators, or disciples, of ten-man rugby. The layman's conception of tough, relentless West Country rugger; full of solid, stimulating ingredients without any garnishing or spice. Solely, maybe, because since time immemorial, the club have bred huge and powerful forwards—fed on concrete, surely, as one London Welsh player was heard to suggest last season!

Gloucester, however, are perfectly well aware that ferric qualities alone do not win seven-a-side competitions. This they demonstrated two years ago when they won against strong opposition the Tewkesbury Festival Sevens, staged to celebrate the 500th anniversary of the War of the Roses, waged partly on Gloucestershire soil.

We are pleased to welcome this famous club in the knowledge they can contribute richly to the spectacle of this great occasion.

MELROSE

The Melrose Club was founded in 1877 after a short and unsuccessful attempt had been made to form a joint club with Gala. This alliance came to an abrupt end when the Melrose members removed themselves together with the club colours and the goal-posts to the Greenyards.

The club has had many successes including the winning of the Border League on seven occasions—the last in 1970/71. The highlight of success however has been the winning of the Scottish unofficial championship on three occasions—1951/52, 1962/63 and 1966/67.

Many members of the club have won international honours including C. W. Drummond, now a member of the S.R.U. Committee, and more recently J. W. Telfer and F. A. L. Laidlaw both of whom captained Scotland and were also British Lions.

In season 1882/83 when the club was in financial difficulties, Edward (Neg) Haig, a butcher's assistant in the town and a playing member of the club, had the idea of the abbreviated game and thus was born Seven-a-Side Rugby. There are many splendid competitions these days but the Melrose event remains the Blue Riband of those in Scotland.

In the Centenary Year of the Scottish Rugby Union we are pleased to welcome this famous club and it is hoped the chosen VII will capture some of the form of the glorious past.

There is an increasing tendency for spectators in their enthusiasm to run on the pitch in support of players both during and at the end of a game. Such action, albeit unwittingly, embeds the grass into the surface, compacts the earth and as a result restricts growth and involves costly maintenance in order to keep the Twickenham turf in the condition which we believe you would like to see it. Accordingly you are requested, please, to assist by **NOT GOING ON THE GRASSED AREA OF THE GROUND AT ANY TIME DURING THIS AFTERNOON.**

Last season's Final Rounds were spoilt for many spectators because of falling cushions, etc. and all attending are asked to ensure such incidents do not happen again so that everybody has an enjoyable day.

You are requested not to move from your seat whilst a game is in progress as it spoils the enjoyment of others.

Every effort has been made to ensure that tickets do not get into the wrong hands. If you have purchased tickets at more than cost price you are invited to forward full details of Stand, Row, Seat No. to the Honorary Secretary (Sevens), M.C.R.F.U., c/o R.F.U., Twickenham, Middlesex.

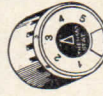

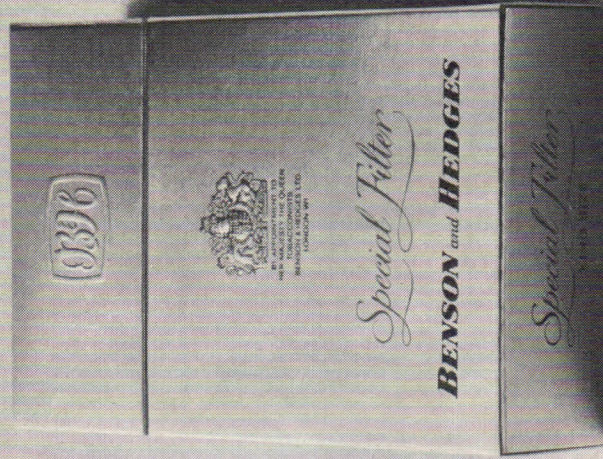
