## Introduction

To customise the look of the iFrame, a new stylesheet can be saved to the File Manager and referenced when generating the iFrame code. The referenced stylesheet will **replace** the default stylesheet.

## Stylesheet Template

The default stylesheet format is shown below. Copy this code into a new file and customise it to achieve the look you require.

## Implementation

Once the custom stylesheet has been created, upload it to the File Manager. Naming it with an underscore as the first character will designate it as a system file and prevent it from being available as an attachment to emails.

To reference it within the iFrame, in the 'Custom Stylesheet Filename' field on step 2 of the 'Capture Leads' process, enter the name of the new stylesheet.

The resulting iFrame should now use the new stylesheet.
