Flow Festival

Flow Festival is a leading European music and arts boutique festival. The festival has been organized in Helsinki since 2004 and it has grown from a small club event to one of the most unique experiences in live music today. In 2015 the 3-day event was sold out, drawing a crowd of 70 000 visitors.

Flow is an inspired mixture of popular culture and experimental arts, staging a handpicked selection of the most interesting and forward thinking music. In addition to music, Flow features visual and cross-disciplinary arts, design, film, topical discussions and a carefully curated offering of food and drinks.







Festival area

Flow Festival is held in the former power plant area of Suvilahti in Helsinki. The constructions date to the early 20th century, and the monumental architectural site is only a short walk or bike ride away from the center of Helsinki. The festival area comes to life with impressive light design and decorations.

The Suvilahti festival area houses 8 to 12 different venues for Flow including larger outdoor stages, tent stages as well as intimate indoor and outdoor ones too. The Main Stage can take up to 23 000 person crowd, while the smaller stages suit audiences of a couple of hundred.

Flow Festival is like a small city packed with culture, music, art, parks, food, drink... and happy people. Something new and surprising always awaits just behind the next corner.

One of the landmarks of the festival is the roof of the Bright Balloon 360° stage – a gigantic pressurized balloon. The stage was created in 2012 as an outcome of an international architecture competition. Balloon fits well into the chronological continuum of Suvilahti and its architectural idea of combining old with new. The Balloon stage presents the audience and the artists with a remarkable chance to interact during shows.







Art & Design

Curated in collaboration with the University of the Arts Helsinki, Flow 2015 presented a broader arts program than ever before with one-off commissions, installations and art pieces around the whole festival area, both indoors and outdoors. Art Laboratory, the new exhibition space launched in 2015, captured the experimental nature of arts.











Flow Talks

Flow Festival and think tank Demos Helsinki proudly presented Flow Talks 2015: Urban Life – an inspiring Friday afternoon consisting of top international keynote speakers, co-creation workshops and a final show. Flow Talks 2015 attracted over 300 participants and gathered a diverse network of festival visitors, urbanists, businesses as well as city representatives to discuss and plan the future of urban life in four different themes: Hyper-Connected City, Communal City, Serving City and Happening City.



Flow Festival Ljubljana was noticed in international media with The Guardian picking it as one of the most interesting festival debutants of the summer.





Eat & Drink


