

RACECOURSE CERTIFICATION INSPECTION FORM

This Inspection, in accordance with Rules 2, 4A and 6 of the current Rules of Racing, will form part of the Certification Procedure of the Certification Body. The requirements set out in this form are derived from the Rules of Racing listed and can be cross-referenced in the accompanying related Rules of Racing document - Appendix A.

A licensed racecourse will be notified by the Certification Body of the GBGB in advance of an Inspection. An Inspection will commence immediately prior to the start of kennelling at the selected meeting. This Inspection is to be carried out by the Area Stipendiary Steward and will be reviewed by the Senior Stipendiary Steward. A verbal report will be given to the Authorised Representative of the Racecourse or an agreed alternative licensed by the racecourse at the end of the Inspection and written confirmation of any non-compliance will be forwarded, by the Senior Stipendiary Steward.


