## Job purpose

- To be responsible for all Reading FC Women 1st Team and Development squad players.
- To maximise the fitness, preparation and performance of the elite players working in conjunction with, and in support of, playing and medical staff.

#### Accountabilities

- To work in co-ordination with the Women's medical team to provide all Physical Preparation activities for Women's football at Reading FC (including Strength & Conditioning, and Sports Science)
- To work in co-ordination with the Women's medical team to create and develop daily, weekly, monthly and seasonal plans to support player conditioning and rehabilitation
- To lead the process of monitoring of player workload, wellness and readiness for all training and match activity, including the collection and storing of information to the player profiles
- To assist the Physiotherapists with screening and testing of the players, including rehabilitation and return to play programs.
- To take the lead on the coaching of group and individual S&C sessions.
- To understand and implement Reading Football Club's Child Protection, Health, Safety and Equal Opportunity procedures as practice.
- To report to the First Team Manager on a daily basis to discuss / plan player and training schedules.
- To support other 1st Team and Academy Physical Preparation staff in their roles and professional development, taking an active role as a mentor
- To actively contribute as part of a coordinated and progressive Medicine & Performance department and the wider football department to the ongoing physical development and progression of the playing squad
- To ensure attendance at all training sessions and matches
