

Production Placements
MO and the Red Ribbon
Roman Road, Bow
Greenwich+Docklands International Festival (GDIF)



We are seeking two Production Placements to assist the festival team in the delivery of *MO and the Red Ribbon*, which will be performed as part of GDIF on Saturday the 29 June 2019 by French company L'Homme Debout in the heart of Bow along Roman Road.

The production placements will be a key part of the delivery team, helping to make *MO and the Red Ribbon* a memorable experience.

There are two different roles:

Role 1: You will focus entirely on the delivery of the production, working closely with Festival Producer Ellie Harris and Production Manager Ben Bodsworth. This will include a mix of office-based and on-site tasks such as prepping production packs, acting as a runner on site, artist liaison, assisting with rehearsals, and all other relevant tasks.

Role 2: You will split your time assisting Marketing Manager, Imogen Thomas, and Access & Community Engagement Manager, Elizabeth Bergeron with the delivery of audience development activity in Bow, such as coordinating participant activity on site and developing (translated as appropriate) promotional materials for dissemination (print and online).

Whilst these are unpaid training and development roles, expenses occurred during these placements will be paid up to a value of £920 (this is calculated as an average of £40 per

day across 24 days). We are looking for a commitment of between 2 to 4 days per week, from 7 May to the 29 June, to be agreed between the individual and GDIF.

Person specification:

- You must be a resident of Bow
- You must be available to commit a minimum of 2 days a week to the festival during the project months
- You are open-minded, positive and a 'can do' attitude
- You have a keen interest in outdoor arts, Festivals and Event work
- You are currently working as or considering working in an Outdoor Arts and/or Festival context
- You have a passion for your community and Arts Events
- You will have an understanding of equal opportunities

- Connect with new people and create a memorable event with and for the local community
- Learn new skills
- Add value to your CV
