Data Protection Privacy Notice for Form: Certificate of Compliance with the Terms and Conditions of the Sports Capital Programme

Part A:

We are fully committed to keeping all personal data submitted to us safe and secure. All necessary technical measures have been put in place to ensure the safety and security of the systems which hold your data.

Being open and transparent in how we process your personal data is important to us and therefore we aim to keep you informed of the purpose(s) for which your personal data will be used and why, where it may be shared elsewhere and why, and how long your data may be held by the Department.

Personal data processed by the Department will only be used for the specific purpose(s) as outlined when the data is collected, or in later communications, and will only be used in accordance with the Data Protection legislation in force.

Data Subject Rights:

When you provide personal data to us you have certain rights available to you in relation to that data. These rights are outlined below and can be exercised by contacting the Data Protection Officer, as detailed above, indicating which right you wish to exercise:

- The right to be informed
- The right of access
- The right to rectification
- The right to erasure
- The right to restrict processing
- The right to data portability

Part B: Information Specific to the Data Being Collected in Form [Certificate of Compliance with the Terms and Conditions of the Sports Capital Programme]

The following data is specific information in relation to the personal data processed for the purposes of Certifying compliance with the Terms and Conditions of the Sports Capital Programme

Specific Purpose:

Form "Certificate of Compliance with the Terms and Conditions of the Sports Capital Programme" is used where a payment request for drawdown of a grant allocation under the Sports Capital programme is submitted.

Certain personal data indeed to process this form correctly in adherence with the published Terms and Conditions of the Sports Capital Programme.

Legal Basis:

There is a legal basis for the collection and processing of the personal data in Form Certificate of Compliance with the Terms and Conditions of the Sports Capital Programme.

The collection and processing of the personal data in the “Certificate of Compliance with the Terms and Conditions of the Sports Capital Programme” is necessary for effective performance of a task carried out in the public interest and in the exercise of official authority vested in the Department namely the administration of the Sports Capital Programme.

Certain personal data is needed to process this form correctly in adherence with the published Terms and Conditions of the Sports Capital Programme.

Recipients:

The information may be shared with the Garda Síochána

Transferred outside the EU/EEA and countries with which there is no adequacy agreement¹

The personal information you provide in this form is not transferred outside the EU/EEA.

Retention period:

The data collected for this purpose will be held by the Department only as long as there is a business need to do so in line with the purpose(s) for which the personal data was collected. After this time it will be marked for destruction and will be destroyed in line with internal guidelines or guidelines for destruction received from the National Archives Office or associated permission received from them or in line with other statutory requirements for destruction.

Data provision being statutory or contractual obligation

The personal data provided for this purpose is being requested under the requirements of the published Terms and Conditions of the Sports Capital Programme. If the information requested in this form is not provided, your application will **not** go any further in the process.

Automated decision making

Automated decision making is not part of the processing of the personal data included in Form Certificate of Compliance with the Terms and Conditions of the Sports Capital Programme.

Information from a third party

Your personal data in relation to the Certificate of Compliance with the Terms and Conditions of the Sports Capital Programme was obtained from a club/organisation in respect allocation received under the Sports Capital Programme in line with this Department’s requirement to adhere to the Procedure’s and Practices of Government Accounting. In circumstances where this Department did not gather your personal data, you are still entitled to exercise your rights in relation to this personal data and the details on how to exercise individuals rights are detailed above.
