## THE HEPWORTH PRIZE FOR SCULPTURE

Today, The Hepworth Wakefield in West Yorkshire announced details of a new £30,000 prize for sculpture, as part of the gallery's 5th anniversary celebrations.

This major new biennial award will recognise, with a £30,000 prize, a British or UK-based artist who has made a significant contribution to contemporary sculpture.

The Prize is open to artists of any age, at any stage in their career and their selection will be based on the significance of their contribution to sculpture in its broadest definition.

The longlist for the award will be compiled by a panel of five nominators: Katrina Brown, Director of Common Guild; Jennifer Higgie, Co-Editor of Frieze; Lisa Le Feuvre, Director of the Henry Moore Institute; Sally Tallant, Director of Liverpool Biennial and Bart van der Heide, Chief Curator at Stedelijk Museum.

The nomination panel will create a shortlist of four artists who will be featured in an exhibition at The Hepworth Wakefield. The shortlist will be judged by a panel of both art world and figures from the public eye to be announced shortly. The four shortlisted artists will present their work in an exhibition at The Hepworth Wakefield in Oct 2016.

The exhibition will bring together a representative body of work by each artist, creating a rich and diverse exhibition. Visitors to the exhibition will be encouraged to judge the Prize, creating public interest and investment in the winner.

Simon Wallis, Director of The Hepworth Wakefield said:

"The launch of a new prize for sculpture is a wonderful way for the gallery to celebrate its fifth year and a fitting legacy to Barbara Hepworth, one of Britain's greatest sculptors. While there is no shortage of prizes in the art world, few specifically recognise sculpture and it is our aspiration to redress that with one of the UK's most important new awards."
