THIS SUMMER THE HEPWORTH WAKEFIELD PRESENTS A NEW EXHIBITION OF SOUND AND LIGHT BY HAROON MIRZA

/

- New installations by Haroon Mirza filled with light, sound and found objects
- Winner of the Northern Art Prize 2010 and Young Silver Lion at 54th Venice Biennale, 2011
- Site specific audio composition using sounds from the River Calder adjacent to the gallery
- Physical light installation working with gallery spaces by David Chipperfield Architects
- Unique presentation of existing artworks from Wakefield's art collection

This summer Northern Art Prize 2010 winner Haroon Mirza will be returning to the North of England to present an exhibition of new work at The Hepworth Wakefield in West Yorkshire.

Opening on Saturday 25 May until 29 September 2013, Mirza's exhibition will feature an audio composition and physical light installation through which the artist will accentuate what usually goes unheard and unseen.

The first gallery space will feature bright auras of light that will illuminate a display featuring key works from The Hepworth Wakefield's collection. Operating in sequence the light will form a visual composition accentuating the formal properties of the sculptures and paintings, and the ways in which they are displayed.

The adjacent gallery space will host a transmission of Mirza's aural composition to become a 'listening room' where visitors can hear the composition that combines the usually unheard sounds of electricity (generated by the adjacent visual light composition) with the River Calder's weir, which flows past the gallery and is usually audibly insulated by the building.

Within the gallery space, a sculptural, hand-crafted antennae will transmit sounds from the weir outside, while silent lightworks embedded into three of the internal walls connect directly with the physical structure of the gallery. One wall is transformed into a sculptural installation of tessellated foam: a visual and practical device whose pattern echoes the repeating composition of transmission and interference. The visual and the acoustic are reintegrated in the space of the exhibition immersing the spectator in a sensory experience that is at odds with the atmosphere of the other gallery spaces in the building where silent or hushed visual contemplation of works of art tends to prevail.

The Haroon Mirza exhibition will be on display concurrently with William Scott, jointly organised with Tate St. Ives and Ulster Museum and also coincides with the artist's solo exhibition at Lisson Gallery,

London. From 17 May until 29 June Mirza will present several new synaesthetic installations made in collaboration with Omar Mirza, the artist's brother and an architect.

Haroon Mirza (b.1977) lives and works in London.
