THE HEPWORTH WAKEFIELD BIDS TO BECOME THE NATION'S FAVOURITE FAMILY FRIENDLY MUSEUM

The Hepworth Wakefield is asking people to help support their bid to become the nation's favourite 'family-friendly' museum. Now in its sixth year, The Family Friendly Museum Award is Britain's biggest museum award in Britain and the only one judged by families. Kids in Museums, sponsored by The Daily Telegraph, is now accepting nominations ahead of next year's judging.

Launched with the support of poet and broadcaster Michael Rosen, a panel of distinguished judges chaired by Jenny Abramsky, Chair of the Heritage Lottery Fund, will draw up the awards shortlist, to be announced in April 2012. The winner will then be announced in May 2012, determined by several families who will visit the six shortlisted museums anonymously to measure the museums against the Kids in Museums Manifesto - '20 ways to make a museum family friendly'.

Simon Wallis, Director of The Hepworth Wakefield said: "I'm very proud of what has been achieved in our first six months of opening and know that a huge part of what we are about is creating a family friendly environment with an inspiring programme of events and activities for visitors of all ages. It would be a wonderful to win this prestigious award, to keep encouraging families to visit us regularly as they now do. I urge everyone to spend just a couple of minutes sending in their nominations and help us to become the nation's number one family friendly museum."

Nominations must submitted by Friday 2 December 2011. People can support the gallery's bid by:

Natalie Walton, Head of Learning for The Hepworth Wakefield said: "The gallery has received lots of wonderful comments for its commitment to family learning. If you have enjoyed your visit to the gallery, but forgot to tell us, now's your chance to do it - we need and value your support!"

Since it opened 6 months ago, the gallery has received widespread critical acclaim, won two major awards, outstripped the initial annual visitor target of 150,000 visitors by welcoming 320,000 people through its doors. This includes 15,000 children and 10,000 adults who have taken part in a learning programme of free resources, drop-in family activities and pre-bookable workshops.

THE HEPWORTH WAKEFIELD

The gallery is at the heart of Wakefield's regeneration. Designed by the internationally acclaimed practice, David Chipperfield Architects, The Hepworth Wakefield measures 5,000 square metres and is the UK's largest purpose-built gallery for over 40 years (since The Hayward in London, built in 1968). The gallery opened 21 May 2011 and has already attracted over 320,000 visitors.

The Hepworth Wakefield is funded by Wakefield Council and Arts Council England with additional funding from a number of charitable trusts and private individuals. Clare Woods: *The Unquiet Head* is supported by the Audrey & Stanley Burton Charitable Trust.

Selected events in The Hepworth Wakefield Autumn/Winter programme are supported by the Art Fund, a fundraising charity which helps UK museums and galleries to buy, show and share art.

The riverside play area is part of the Three Area's Project into Change4Life, which is funded by NHS Wakefield District and Wakefield Council, as well as allocated funds via the Governments Playbuilder Capital Programme.
