Key Knowledge

Passing

Passing is a way of moving the ball from person to person within the same team. There are different ways to pass a netball, including a chest pass, bounce pass, shoulder pass or overhead pass.

Defending

Defending is reducing the opposition's chance of scoring, by retrieving possession of the ball, or by creating distance between the ball and their net. The further the opposition player with the ball is from your net as a defender, the less chance they have of scoring.

Shooting

Shooting is the throwing of the ball towards the net, with the main aim of scoring. A shot is lighter than a pass, as the ball needs to travel up, and drop into the net. If the ball isn't in the middle of the ring, it will bounce off.

Positions

Netball teams have seven players on the court at one time. The six positions are; Goalkeeper, Goal Defense, Wing Defense, Centre, Wing Attack, Goal Attack, Goal Shooter.

Key Vocabulary

Passing	The moving of the ball from one player to another.
Travelling	The ball carrier can balance on one foot, using the other to pivot in a circle. If the planted foot is lifted, a foul is awarded.
Attacking	Keeping possession of the ball, reducing the distance between the ball and the opposition's basket, with the main aim of scoring. The ball carrier cannot move with the ball, so the only way to progress up the court is through passing.
Defending	Reducing the opposition's chance of scoring by intercepting the ball and creating distance between the ball & your own basket. The ball cannot be taken out an opponent's hands.
Shooting	The throwing of the ball towards the basket, with the main aim of scoring.
Free Pass	When a foul is committed that doesn't directly affect a player, i.e., footwork.
Penalty Pass	When a foul is committed that directly impacts a player, i.e., contact. The infringing player must stand next to the player passing the ball.

Jade is primarily a midcourt defender, selected for England for the first time in 2002, and currently playing for Leeds Rhinos Netball.



Eleanor Cardwell

Eleanor is primarily a goal attack/goal shooter. First selected for England in 2016, she currently plays for Manchester Thunder.

Jess is a former England international player, and the current head coach of the national team. She was a member of Team Bath, who won the inaugural Netball Super League title.
