Key Knowledge

Passing

Passing is a way of moving the ball from person to person within the same team. Football passing is completed with the feet, primarily using the inside of the foot. Passing can be completed over different distances, and the technique will change depending on the distance the ball needs to travel.

Dribbling

Dribbling is travelling while maintaining control of the ball. Dribbling should be completed using both feet, to allow the participant to change direction without having to stop. Dribbling is the most used skill in football, as between every pass, a player needs to dribble to move with the ball.

Defending

Defending is reducing the oppositions' chance of scoring, by retrieving possession of the ball, or by creating distance between the ball and their goal. The further the opposition player with the ball is from your goal as a defender, the less chance they have of scoring.

Shooting

Shooting is the kicking of the ball towards the goal, with the main aim of scoring a goal. A shot is generally kicked harder than a pass, and the attackers will aim for the corners of the goal. This reduces the chance of the goalkeeper reaching the ball & saving it.

Key Vocabulary

Passing	The moving of the ball from one player to another.
Dribbling	Travelling around the pitch, while keeping control of the ball.
Attacking	Keeping possession of the ball, reducing the distance between the ball and the opposition's goal, with the main aim of scoring.
Defending	Reducing the oppositions' chance of scoring by intercepting the ball and creating distance between the ball & your own goal.
Shooting	The kicking of the ball when trying to score a goal. The player will aim for the corners so reduce the chance of the goalkeeper reaching it.
Goalkeeper	Each team has one goalkeeper. They're responsible for standing in the goal. They're the only players who can use their hands.
Offside	The offside line is from the defender closest to their own goal. As they move, the offside line moves. If an attacker is passed the ball, starting past the final defender, a free kick is awarded to the opposition team.
Freekick	A free kick is awarded for a foul, or not following the laws of the game. A free kick must take place from the point of the foul. The ball must be still before it can be kicked.
Penalty	A penalty is awarded for a foul or not following the laws of the game, within the penalty box that surrounds the goal. The penalty is always taken from the same spot, with all other players staying outside the box till it's kicked. The spot is always 12 yards from the goal.
