This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

#### Part A: Curriculum music

The children have an hour music timetabled each week. This is normally linked to the Kapow scheme of music, but adapted where necessary for year groups and the children in the specialist provision.

#### Part B: Co-curricular music

The children have opportunities to sing during our weekly singing assembly. They have the option to sign up to our EYFS/KS1 and KS2 singing clubs. Key stage 1 and 2 pupils have the opportunity to sign up to learn ukulele or guitar through our Front Row Music provider and key stage 2 pupils have the opportunity to join a band through our Rocksteady provider. Both of these providers offer opportunities to gain music awards. Pupil premium children are offered a funded place to learn an instrument.

## **Part C: Musical experiences**

Each key stage 2 class has the opportunity to perform at least once per year to show case what they have been learning in the music curriculum. The singing club has 3 opportunities per year to sing at the residential homes in our town of Hedon. Each year the East Riding Music Service performs a children concert for our children. Those children learning an instrument through Front Row or Rocksteady perform at least twice per year to parents/carers and to the whole school. The year 6 put on an end of year musical which is performed to the whole school and to parents and extended family members. EYFS and Y1 put on a Nativity and Easter Bonnet parade for parents. Finally Inmans participates in community events such as Hedfest and carol services.

### In the future

The school will continue to offer a high quality music education to our pupils here at Inmans Primary School.
