Art Implementation

Art lessons are planned and taught based on the National Curriculum and linked to the topics and enquiries for each year group. They are engaging, challenging and motivate children to improve their art skills. The long term plan also reflects this and shows the progression of skills and knowledge throughout the year groups. The work of artists is very important to the curriculum at Inmans Primary school and this is evident through the planning and teaching of art in school. Children also have further opportunities to develop their artistic skills and knowledge. During these projects, children use collaborative learning to study different artists from varying cultures and styles to enhance their art knowledge. This can build upon the knowledge gained within timetabled art lessons and create a broader artistic knowledge.

Staff support and challenge children appropriately within art lessons to ensure progression and development. Assessment is used regularly and ensure full coverage of the curriculum is taught throughout the year.
