Almost all of the early History learning can be found in 'Understanding the World', one of the 7 learning areas.




-Family are people who are related to one another. -Friends are people who like spending time together.

-An experience is something that happens to us in our lives. Important experiences are called life events. Life events may include:





-We share some things with other people. Some things make us unique (different to everyone else).

A way of life is how you choose to spend your time. -An occupation is a job – what you do for work. -Occupations include: teacher, policeman, chef, etc.

Knowledge: Our World

-Our world is a planet called Earth. It is one of a number of planets that go around the Sun. -On Earth, there are many different countries. In each country, there are cities, towns and villages. -Which country do you live in? Which town/city?

Nature and Objects

-Humans share the planet with lots of other living things, including plants and animals. -Animals and plants live in many different ways.

-There are also things that people have made in the world, for example buildings and cars.

Changes over Time

-Humans go through life stages: baby, toddler, child, teenager, adult and old people. -Other things change over time too. For example, they can grow, shrink, decay and die


