Building Update

Roofing works are nearing completion The next area is the front entrance. Please watch out for the email during half term with an update regarding an alternative entrance after half term.

KS2 Snack Shop

All transactions will be cashless and will be charged on Arbor! If your child wishes to visit the Snack Shop, please ensure that your 'Snack Shop' Arbor account is topped up. This will work the same as the 'Meals' account, and the balance will deduct accordingly each day. All KS2 (Y3-Y6) pupils can use the snack shop at morning breaktime and choose a bagel or fruit. The orders will be taken each morning during register time.

Snacks / Packed Lunch

A reminder that we are a **nut-free school** to help keep all pupils safe. Please do not send any nut products in packed lunches or snacks, including items such as Nutella sandwiches, B-Ready bars, or any foods containing nuts. Our KS2 snack shop is available every day, where children can have a bagel or fruit. Alternatively, children are welcome to bring a healthy snack for playtime such as a bread roll, breadsticks, rice cakes, fruit, vegetable sticks or a cereal bar. Please do not send chocolate bars or chocolate-coated biscuits as breaktime snacks. All EYFS and KS1 pupils are provided with a piece of fruit each day for their morning breaktime. Thank you for your support in helping us maintain a safe and healthy environment for everyone.

Arbor Accounts - Debts

Please ensure your Arbor accounts are topped up in advance for: School meals, Wraparound Care & KS2 Snack Shop. Please note that Arbor does not send automatic reminders when balances are running low, so we kindly ask parents/carers to make a habit of checking their Arbor accounts weekly to ensure balances remain in credit. Our admin team does send reminder emails where possible, but keeping accounts topped up helps reduce the workload. Thank you for your cooperation and for helping us keep systems running smoothly. Your support is very much appreciated.

Monthly Drop-in Sessions with Family Practitioner

Next session: Thursday 5th March 3pm-4pm.

Chris Shearsmith, a Family Practitioner who works with local Early Help teams, will be attending our school on the first Thursday of every month from 3:00-4:00pm. This is a great opportunity for parents and carers to drop in for an informal chat about any concerns you may have. Chris can offer advice and support on a wide range of family matters, including sleep routines, bedwetting, behaviour at home, emotional wellbeing, school worries, parenting strategies, family changes, attendance concerns and accessing additional local support services.

If you would like to speak with Chris, please come to the main office between 3:00pm and 4:00pm to sign in. A private room will be available to ensure comfort and confidentiality. We hope families will take advantage of this supportive service.

Absence from School for exceptional circumstances

If you need to take your child out of school (eg-funeral, wedding, holiday) we ask you to fill in an Absence Form. This can be found on our website using the link above and paper copies can be picked up from the office.

Medical / Illness

Medication - If prescribed medicine is needed 4 times a day we can administer this once for you, we can not administer in school if it's only 3 times a day. We can only administer items that are prescribed by a doctor/dentist & have a pharmacy label. Parents/carers must fill in a medical consent form.

Illness / Medical appointments / Late in to school

If your child is going to be late into school due to a medical appointment, please let us know. If you're leaving a voicemail please state what your child's lunch arrangements are. If your child is ill & absent from school, please call before 9am, the voicemail is the first option, the line opens at 8am. Please clearly state your child's full name, class and give as much detail as possible and be specific of ailments of why they're off ill.

End of day pick up arrangements

Please inform the office before 2pm of any changes to home time arrangements. Eg-if your child is not attending an after school club, if your child is being picked up by a relative, if you'd like them to use the drive-through pick up etc.

Reading / Homework

At Inmans we encourage children to read at least four times a week. This is the main focus of homework and benefits children in so many ways. Even 5 minutes a day can support fluency so please support your child by listening to them read.

Uniform Policy

School Uniform: Red/white polo shirt, black/grey trousers/skirt, red sweatshirt/cardigan, grey/red gingham dress. Inmans branded is not compulsory, but they can be purchased from Steady SchoolWear or Rawcliffes.

PE Kit: Black shorts/joggers, white round neck t-shirt, black zip up jacket, trainers. Children should not be wearing brand makes for PE. eg: Monterrain Tracksuits

Jewellery: One set of studs in ears only. Please do not wear jewellery on PE Days.

Parents/Carers are invited to join us in school, to read with their child in class.

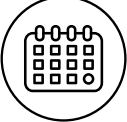
