

Grange Primary Sports Premium Spending 2013-14

The total amount of sports premium funding received by the school in 2013-14 was £9245

Activity	Cost	Impact
Sports coaching – We use two local coaching companies to provide sports coaching across the school. Children in eight out of the ten classes in 13-14 received high quality sports coaching for one lesson a week with their class teacher leading the other PE lesson each week.	Embrace - £5210 Jonny Hughes - £2552	Pupils have received high quality coaching from specialist instructors who are passionate about sport and are therefore more able to inspire pupils than many teachers would be. They have also brought in their own equipment which has improved the quality of provision. Often two members of staff are provided and can work with small groups to develop skills. Specialist knowledge of sports has meant that pupils have learned correct rules and have had the opportunity to practise skills in supervised matches.
Out of school clubs We subsidise the costs of a sports coach to run a multi-skills sports club for KS1 and one for Lower KS2 as well as a tag rugby club for Years 5 and 6.	Simon Evitts - £1260	30% of our pupils have attended heavily subsidised after school sports clubs which has meant that they have had additional opportunities to exercise and keep healthy as well as to develop a love of sport. It has also meant for some pupils that they have had something productive to do after school which keeps them out of potential trouble. We have also seen improved coordination many of our younger children who attend these clubs.
Transport to cricket tournament	£100	We are very lucky to have excellent school grounds so we organise tournaments here generally but this funding enabled us to take the cricket team to a tournament in Condover. The standard of cricket at the tournament was very high which gave our players an opportunity to develop their skills and inspired them to work hard to achieve higher standards.
Employing experts to organise the school Colin Howard cricket tournament and the Shrewsbury Area Sports event.	£200	Due to other commitments in school there was no one available this year to organise the annual cricket tournament that we host and it was at risk of not happening. Sports Premium enabled us to employ somebody to organise this event which gave our cricket team an opportunity to play competitive matches. Area sports has been arranged by a different school each year but increasing pressures on schools meant that this was also at risk of folding. Sports premium enabled us to contribute to a central pot for a company to organise the event. This is an excellent event for our best athletes to compete against others and to be inspired to push themselves further.
Equipment – tennis balls, ropes etc.	£50	Some of our basic PE stock was somewhat depleted which meant that children were having to share equipment and therefore wait too long in lessons to develop skills that required a specific piece of equipment such as a tennis ball. The impact has been that PE lessons have involved more of the children more of the time in skills development rather than just fitness activities while they wait. This will remain a priority in the coming year as we continue to build up stock.
