This will allow the SEN/Interventions to be targeted and delivered by the HLTAs and TAs. Training can be undertaken by the TAs.</p>

Outcomes to date:

Limited success in letters and sounds programme as children did not make national expectations in Y1 phonics test. (Parents' sessions on phonics and grammar planned.)

Children who have received one to one support have made good progress. These children have continued to make good progress in Year 6 since having the one to one support last year.

Allocation of extra TA support has shown moderate success where children have made at least expected progress. Children have continued to make good progress over the autumn term due to the extra support they have received.

The Counselling was initially targeted with 3 LAC however we have used more Pupil Premium to support a further 3 children.

Future Spending

To aid the progress of children receiving Pupil premium I am releasing the 0.4 teacher from class in the next academic year. She will take PPA for KS2. This in turn will allow the HLTAs to concentrate their support and use specific, identified and targeted interventions that are timetabled. This will also give us the evidence to look at the cost effectiveness – impact of some of the interventions we are using.

School is looking to purchase Purple Mash – Raising Standards Through Creativity on a 5 year contract at a cost of £3500 for the 5 years. It contains resources and programmes to support children struggling with phonics and reading as well as taking an electronic multimedia approach to learning that will engage many of our children.

The TA supporting the large class moving into Y1 has been given a contract for another year.
