2013-2014 Pupil Premium Impact

Phonics screening Year 1:

Pupil Premium children: 64% met the standard, which is the same as for pupil premium children nationally.

Non Pupil Premium children: 73% met the standard, which is slightly below the percentage nationally.

Key Stage 1 standards:

Pupil Premium children are around six months progress behind non pupil premium children in reading, writing and mathematics.

Key Stage 2 standards:

At the end of Year 6 2014, within school there is no difference in the standards reached by Pupil Premium and non- Pupil Premium children. Compared to all non- Pupil Premium pupils nationally, the standards reached by our Pupil Premium children are around one year behind. Compared to previous years, we have reduced the gap between the standards reached by both these groups of pupils. In mathematics and reading, Pupil Premium children do slightly better than others, whilst in writing the non- pupil premium children do slightly better.

Key Stage 2 progress:

The proportions of children making expected or more than expected progress in 2013-14:

Reading: Pupil Premium children: 100% made expected progress, which is better than national average.

Non Pupil Premium: 88% made expected progress, which is broadly in line with national average.

Mathematics: Pupil Premium children: 68% made expected progress, which is below the national average.

Non Pupil Premium: 59% made expected progress, which is below the national average.

Writing: Pupil Premium children: 77% made expected progress, which is slightly below the national average.

Non Pupil Premium: 88% made expected progress, which is slightly below the national average.
