I have been spending time with the LA and with Nifty Lifts and Shenley Village to ensure that we make productive use of the time to develop strong partnerships and joint projects in the time leading up to the deferred opening. So, whilst disappointing, we, and the LA, are retaining our commitment to the expansion process for OPA and remain positive in the face of adversity! I will update you further in the new term — or earlier if there are any developments.
