

PE and Sport Grant: 2014 - 2015

Cuckoo Hall Academy has been in receipt of additional government funding specified as 'Sport Premium' since its introduction in September 2013. For the last two academic years each school in England has received £8000 plus £5 per child on roll. Schools are free to spend the Sport Premium as they see fit since as they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for all the pupils within their school. This extra funding must be spent on Physical Education and school sport. We will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding and from April 2014 we are required to publish online information regarding how we have used the Sport's Premium and the impact it has made. To meet this requirement the following information has been produced which sets out the amount of Sport Premium we received and how we used it. We aimed to utilise this extra funding to improve all aspects of Physical Activity. These included: maximising pupil progress, increasing participation in sport, professional development of staff and to help all our pupils to develop healthy lifestyles and positive attitudes towards Physical Education.

In 2014-2015 a vast majority of our pupils achieved the expected national level as well as a majority of pupils working towards the stage above. There is a marginal difference in Years 3 & 4. There will be an additional focus on pupils in Years 3 and 4 to ensure they are working in line with other cohorts.

Cuckoo Hall Academy received **£11,290** Sports Premium Funding for the academic year 2014-15.
