RECEPTION: Well what a fabulous first half term we have had. We are over the moon with how well the children have settled. So far we have covered s a t p i n m d g o c k letters and their sounds. We have also been practising numbers to 10, reading, writing and counting. The first week after half term we will be having a Harvest focus. I would really appreciate any fresh orange skins for a fiddle finger task please. Have a lovely half term.

YEAR 1: Year 1 have had a really busy week. We have continued to work on instructions and even made Noah's Ark! The children have worked really hard with subtraction and number bonds within 10. If possible please could you try to listen to your child read. We hope you all enjoy your break and stay safe.

YEAR 2: We come to the end of a very busy half term. Everyone is working hard in year 2 and are ready for a well-earned rest! Thank you everyone for coming to parents evening, it was nice to talk to you and talk about your children's work. I have sent some high frequency words for the children to practise sentences during the holidays and their Mathletics passwords if they would like to try this too.

YEAR 3: What a busy last week in Year 3. Children have taken part in Tennis, Rugby and Football sessions. They have also continued with work on time in Maths and in Literacy we have had a week looking at performance poetry. It was nice to meet and speak to you all about your children at Parents evening and, as always, please don't hesitate to contact one of us if there is anything you need to know. After half term Year 3 will have **tennis** on **Tuesday** and **swimming** on **Wednesday**. Please ensure children have the correct kit with them on these days. Swimming will run for about 4 weeks and then it will stop for the lead up to Christmas when school gets extremely busy! Year 3 will then return to swimming for the Summer term. Have a lovely half term and see you all on the 2nd November!

YEAR 4: We have come to the end of a very busy half term where the children have worked really hard. This week we have been solving problems to do with addition and subtraction and finishing writing up our stories in English. When we return after half term we will be thinking about multiplying 2 and 3 digit numbers in maths and our RE work will be exploring the theme of Trust in God. Our PE after half term will change; we will have multi skills on a Thursday – Black shorts and white t shirts please, and swimming on a Wednesday. It was great to meet you all at parent's evening this week to discuss the progress that the children have made. Have a great half term everyone!

YEAR 5: Miss Mullan has enjoyed teaching year 5 for the first half term and was really pleased to meet parents on Wednesday evening. She is sorry she had to cancel her parents evening on Thursday due to being unwell. She will rearrange this once she returns to school after the half term break. She hopes the children all have a lovely week off!

YEAR 6: It's been a busy last week in Year 6! On Monday, 8 children went to a rehearsal at Millom School to practise the songs and dance moves for the Young Voices Concert in March. Another 19 children took part in a football tournament on Tuesday. As well as that, they have continued with work on addition and subtraction in Maths, and in Literacy we have had a week looking at narrative writing based on the story, 'The Giant's Necklace'. After half term, we will be learning more about multiplication and division; any times tables practise over the holidays would be very much appreciated! It was nice to meet you all at Parents' evening. If you have any concerns, please don't hesitate to contact me. Year 6 have been asked by the Parents' Guild to put together a 'bathroom' themed hamper, to be raffled at the Christmas Fair. We would be grateful if the children could bring a contribution, which could include anything from soap to sponges. Have a lovely half term and see you all on the 2nd November!

NO DOGS IN THE PLAYGROUND. THANK YOU: Can we please ask that you do not bring dogs into the playground when you are picking children up from school or dropping them off. Thank you.

ILLNESS: Please remember to ring into school in the morning if your child is absent, stating the nature of their illness. Could we also remind you that if your child is absent due to sickness and / or diarrhoea, the recommended time they need to be absent from school is 48 hours from the last episode. This is to help reduce the spread of infection. Thank you for your help with this.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Just a reminder of our official school uniform which should be worn by all pupils;

GIRLS UNIFORM: Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights.

BOYS UNIFORM: Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks.
All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather.

LABELS: All uniform should have your child's name on it. Please also label coats and pumps.

PE KITS

All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform.

PE KIT: White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps (not trainers).

If your child does not have their kit, they will not be able to do PE. This includes pumps or trainers. Thanks for your help with this.
