Unicef is the worlds' largest organisation working for children and their rights.

In 1989, governments worldwide promised all children the same rights by adopting the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC). These rights are based on what the child needs to survive, grow and participate and fulfil their potential.

The RRSA will help our pupils grow into confident, caring and responsible young citizens both in school and in the wider community. By learning about their rights, pupils also learn about the importance of respecting the rights of others.

Manor Fields pupils are encouraged to reflect on how their behaviour and actions affect those around them, which allows us to build a positive and safe learning environment for all, both in class and all around the school site.
