RECEPTION: We all really enjoyed Children in Need day, it was fun coming to school in our own clothes and having our faces painted. We have worked hard with our 'Farmer Duck' story and enjoyed performing it for Years 1 and 2. Next week we will be looking at the 'Little Red Hen' story. We have enjoyed measuring and liked using our hands and feet to measure. It was fun measuring how tall we are. Next week we will be looking at numbers. In RE we are looking at the story of Noah's Ark. Have a lovely weekend.

YEAR 1: We have had a lovely week in Year 1! We have been learning the story Percy Park Keeper and the Treasure Hunt...maybe the children could tell you about it over the weekend? We will be continuing with this story next week. In Maths we have been looking at 3D shapes and half/quarter turns, and the children have really enjoyed challenging each other with different commands. Thank you for people who have brought wellies in! The weather has been so bad that we will have to judge the afternoons next week, and possibly visit the park then. Have a lovely weekend!

YEAR 2: Another busy week has flown by in Year 2. We have been subtracting numbers in many different ways and have all worked really hard. Next week we are looking at some word problems linked to adding and finding missing numbers. In Literacy we are starting to change our main text creating new characters, settings and ideas. We are going to look for unusual ideas and hopefully at the end of this work make some little books for the book corner. In RE we are looking at the Angel Gabriel's visit to Mary hopefully we are going to do some art linked to this for a class display. In Science we have been looking at the life cycle of a butterfly and next week we are going on to look at life cycles of other farm animals. Next week we are going to start learning our Carols ready for the Carol service in church so be ready to practice them at home! Have a great weekend.

YEAR 3: We've had a great week in Year 3, looking at using inverted commas in Literacy and ordering and comparing numbers up to 100 in Maths. Children enjoyed Mass on Tuesday and can we say a massive thank you for all the cakes that you sent it. It is greatly appreciated by us all. We have started our new topic, Mary Mother of God. We will be putting together a classroom altar for Mary so if the children have anything special - pictures, rosary beads, flowers etc that they would like to bring in to go on the altar that would be great. We finished our week with a great 'Children in Need' day - thanks again for your support with this. Next week is anti-bullying week and we will be completing some activities to support this. Have a lovely weekend.

YEAR 4: What a busy week! The children have impressed me with their maths work on multiplication and have been solving problems involving multiplying 3 digit numbers! In Literacy we have begun a new unit of work linked to our topic of WW2 with a particular focus on what it was like to be evacuated. We will be doing some diary writing about this in the coming weeks. In RE we have been thinking about Trust and our focus will turn to how Mary trusted in God. There are a number of children forgetting PE and swimming kits. Please can you ensure that your child has their PE kit is school on Thursdays and swimming kit on Wednesday, Thank you. We have begun learning some of the songs for our upcoming Christmas Play - 'Straw and Order' so you may be hearing some of the songs at home too. Have a great weekend!

YEAR 5: I am very happy to be back in school with the children and I have been thrilled to see how enthusiastic they are to work on our new topic! On Monday we explored how volcanoes are formed and the children produced some brilliant comic strips which explain this. On Tuesday we enjoyed a workshop based upon Alfred Wainwright. The children had great fun learning about his life and creating landscape drawings in the style of Wainwright. This week also saw the beginning of our Christmas play rehearsals for *Straw and Order* in which we will be performing as the cows, so please could you start putting together a costume. We are going to wear black or brown pants with an old white top which we can either paint black/brown splodges on or cut holes into with a black/brown top underneath. Finally, each class in the school is creating a Christmas hamper for our school Christmas Fair raffle and this year the theme is chocolate. The hampers need to be ready by 1st December, so if you are able to send any chocolate related items in before then (this can range from chocolate bars to chocolate scented candles) we would be very grateful. I hope you all have a lovely weekend!

YEAR 6: What a hectic week it's been! Christmas is fast approaching and we have turned our thoughts to the Christmas play, *Straw and Order*. We have started to learn some of the songs and are beginning to cast different parts. We try really hard to accommodate the children's wishes, but sometimes we can't give the children the parts they would like; there is only one Mary in the nativity! We would really appreciate your support in explaining this to your child, if they are disappointed. In Maths, we have been learning how use a formal method for long multiplication and in Literacy we are learning about how to use language to create a sense of adventure in stories. We will be beginning our Science topic next week, starting by learning about the circulatory system. Before half term I wrote about collecting items to go in a bathroom themed hamper, ready for the Christmas fair. As yet, we have no contributions from the children: items such as shampoo, bubble baths, face cloths and fancy soaps would all be very much appreciated. The items should not be expensive. NO DOGS IN THE PLAYGROUND. THANK YOU: Can we please ask that you do not bring dogs into the playground when you are picking children up from school or dropping them off. Thank you.

ILLNESS: Please remember to ring into school in the morning if your child is absent, stating the nature of their illness. Could we also remind you that if your child is absent due to sickness and / or diarrhoea, the recommended time they need to be absent from school is 48 hours from the last episode. This is to help reduce the spread of infection. Thank you for your help with this.

IMPORTANT! HEAD LICE: Please can you check your child's head. We have had some instances of head lice since the start of the term. Once they have been treated we would suggest that parents try to check their child's head once a week to ensure that they have not been re-infected. Please call at either of the chemists to obtain lotion to treat children.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Just a reminder of our official school uniform which should be worn by all pupils;

GIRLS UNIFORM: Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights.

BOYS UNIFORM: Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks.

All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather.

LABELS: All uniform should have your child's name on it. Please also label coats and pumps.

PE KITS

All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform.

PE KIT: White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps (not trainers).

If your child does not have their kit, they will not be able to do PE. This includes pumps or trainers. Thanks for your help with this.
