New Curriculum

The new national curriculum became statutory in schools in September 2014. The new assessment system became statutory in September 2015

Levels

Levels such as 2b, 3a+, 4c will no longer be used to assess children's progress and ability

Key Performance Indicators (KPI's)

- Each of the curriculum areas is split into chunks call Key Performance Indicators (KPI's)
- Every single skill within each subject will be assessed
- KPI's are different for every subject in every year group
- Learning is built upon year to year
- Our assessment programme tracks each child's progress as they work through the KPI's
- This framework enables us to pinpoint the aspects of the curriculum in which children are falling behind whilst also recognising exceptional performance

Age Related Expectations (ARE)

Through the academic year children would typically follow this pattern of progress:-

1 0		
Emerging	Some KPI's achieved – approx 25%	
Developing	More KPI's achieved 25% - 75%	
Secure	Most KPI's achieved over 75%	

So for example a child who has achieved 80% of their KPI's for their year groups curriculum would be secure/achieving Age Related Expectations

Children who are working beyond secure will move onto the mastery programme for their year group. This is more in depth learning. *Children will not move onto the following year group's curriculum.*

Reporting to Parents

- Annual End of Year written report for each child
- In the report we will identify if your child is at Emerging, Developing,
 Secure or Mastery levels for their year group in reading, writing and maths
- We will continue to meet with you to discuss your child's progress in the Autumn and Spring Terms with the option to meet in Summer if you wish
