In respect of the 2014/2015 academic year, our school has received £16,900 pupil premium grant for 13 pupils. This money is being used in a number of different ways to support the learning of the students concerned:

Spent on:	Aim
Small Group/One to One Tuition and support	Reading, maths, emotional, comprehension, 1 to 1 support / tuition to help children reach their full potential.
Funding places on School Visits	To enhance the curriculum, ensure the children are able to participate and to give children the opportunity to experience new and challenging activities
Intervention Services	To help children reach their full potential, both academically and socially
Support Staff and Resources	An increase in staffing costs to help children in key areas of English, Mathematics and Personal Development. Purchasing new resources to support children's learning in these key areas.
Teaching Staff	An increase in staffing costs in order to champion pupils' support

IMPACT OF PUPIL PREMIUM (2014/15) 13 children

The school has used the human and material resources provided through the pupil premium in order to help raise standards for those who are entitled to benefit from it through a range of intervention strategies. Attainment and progress have been monitored throughout the year in order that impact may be reported.

2 levels + PROGRESS FROM END OF KEY STAGE 1 TO END OF KEY STAGE 2

Reading 100% Writing 100% Maths 100%

3 levels PROGRESS FROM END OF KEY STAGE 1 TO END OF KEY STAGE 2

Reading 80% Writing 20% Maths 20%

As both the curriculum and means of assessment have changed this year (apart for those children in Years 2 and 6), it is not possible to use a standardised format to measure the progress from the end of summer 2014 to 2015. We no longer have levels. Rather, the new curriculum works towards 'End of Year Standards' and these are measured according to whether pupils are entering (E), developing (D) or secure (S) within their EOY standards. However, due to the higher challenges and expectations of the new curriculum, the children

will not have been able to cover all of the earlier building blocks required to achieve these standards. This means that for this year, even though the children will have made progress, they may still not be working securely at the expected end of year standard. For this reason, and for this year only, we are combining D and S for the 9 children in Years 3, 4 and 5:

Attainment: D/S: Reading 78% (7) Writing 67% (6) Maths 78% (7)
