

## Pupil Sport Premium Spending Report 2015/16

Woodlands uses its Sport premium grant to release our specialist PE teacher to undertake a range of exciting and dynamic activities with young people and staff alike. We offer a diverse range of curriculum sports, in addition to opportunities to participate in competitive sport, and access to activities such as; dance, rugby, sitting volleyball, table cricket, polybat, table tennis, Boccia, athletics, water play sessions (including swimming lessons at the local leisure centre) and outdoor education.



The aim of our Sports Premium funded provision continues to be focused on ensuring that every child can access as many activities as possible and find something they enjoy taking part in. At the same time, we are focused in developing the skills of classroom teachers and staff in delivering high quality sport experiences through exposure to high quality sport sessions with the release teacher and external coaches. Providing ongoing CPD opportunities for teachers and other adults supporting learning to improve their PE subject knowledge, competencies and confidence is key to securing young people's success.

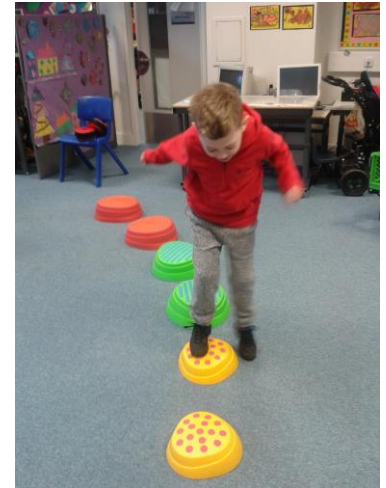
### Use of Sports Premium Funding during 2015/16

**Our grant for 2015/16 totalled: £8,183. Our use of the grant includes:**

- Provision of a PE Release Teacher and the Sports TA work one day a week to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE.
- 100% young people have experienced sporting activities both on and off site, that are motivating, demand participation and have had a definite impact on their lives.
- 80% of KS1 & 2 pupils have participated in specialist sports activities (Sailing, swimming, tennis, boccia, climbing) which has led to improvements in their confidence and interaction levels and self-expression.
- Provision of Specialist Disability Sports Coaches working within Woodlands School to develop staff skills and confidence. Professional development opportunities in PE/sport for all staff to participate in rowing, poly bat, seated volley ball and new age curling.
- Provided opportunities for individual pupils to have their talents 'spotted' by National Sport Governing Body representatives attending our sports sessions
- Change4Life lunchtime clubs to target less active and previously less motivated pupils and a range of pupils from KS1 to KS5 access these daily. We have also provided training for MTAs in Rowing so they can run clubs at lunchtimes.



- Level 1 competitions are facilitated in PE lessons as part of lesson planning and also during lunchtimes and at after school clubs
- Provision of level 2 competitions for KS1 and 2 pupil to participate in inclusive sport
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- subsidising places for pupils on after school sport clubs
- Opportunities provided to pupils try out new sports and activities that motivate and enthuse our children including climbing, para-climbing, bowls, and water polo.
- Access to a gifted and talented provision 'Pro-ability Tennis Academy' which runs weekly
- Close monitoring of sport skills using the 'Core skills tests' at the start of each term, pupil progress is followed and we observe how our pupils transfer skills across different sports.
- Support for teachers using Motor Skills United as a tool to record pupil's progress in fine and gross motor skills along with proprioception, kinaesthesia and body awareness.
- Support for teachers to embed good assessment for learning (AfL) methodology into day to day planning, teaching and assessment of pupils work in sport and PE



- Creating the school's sports provision through the building of effective networks and partnerships. We work closely with partners including Active Devon, Plymouth CC Sport Development Unit, Special Olympics Plymouth and District, British Rowing, CP Sports, LTA, Boccia England and Mount Batten Water sports Centre.
- Involving children and young people in the management, organisation and delivery of PE and school sport is key to promoting good participation. We have a School Sport Committee that meets regularly to discuss sport provision across the school and in Level 2 competition and help to organise the annual Primary Ability Games with Marjons Event Management students.
- We strongly act on the views of pupils, parents and carers.

We ask our young people what sports they want to do or try and parents/carers who have suggested activities and places to go e.g. Brimpts Farm and attending the Stoke Mandeville National Wheelpower Games.

- We provide suitable pathways into activities beyond school and building effective school to club links, such as Mount Batten Sailing, 1st for Tennis, Swimming.



## Action Plan For Sports Premium Use at Woodlands School

We will....

- have staff who are confident and competent to deliver high quality PE. The quality of all lessons observed in sport/PE will be good or outstanding.
- Staff will have increased confidence to use PE assessment systems to monitor and track pupil progress (Motor Skills United and PE Skills assessments)
- ensure that pupils are able to access a broad offer of school sport activities (as participants, leaders or organisers), offer an extensive range of sports including sports that pupils may not otherwise experience and demonstrate how numerous young people represent the school and are part of community clubs that the school has links with
- Continue to celebrate PE and Sport across the life of the School and use the positive values of Sport across subject areas to further integrate it into our school's ethos
- further develop the role of the sports committee to review sport and PE across the school and look for new opportunities out there for our pupils and foster positive relationships with other schools
- Ensure teachers / staff focus on the wider benefits of PE and Sport and link this to core subject learning and skills use.
