The Christian ethos is at the heart of all we do in school.
We are a caring school and the behaviour policy aims to help everyone feel happy safe and secure in our school.

What do we try to do?

- We have a number of school rules but this policy **is not** about just enforcing school rules.
- This policy aims to help everyone work together in a positive way
- School expects **everyone** to be considerate towards **everyone**
- We reward good behaviour in lots of different ways

Rewards and punishments

We make sure good behaviour happens by-

- Praising children for good behaviour
- Encouraging the older children to set good examples for younger children by helping them at lunchtimes and playtimes
- Expecting all children to treat all children and adults with respect
- Sharing good achievements in special mentions assemblies
- Having a whole school code of conduct and by having simple class rules

Sometimes it is necessary to use a number of sanctions to enforce school rules and ensure that school is a safe place to be – these might be to -

- Sit near the teacher if children talk or misbehave in class
- Re do a piece of work if children have not tried their best
- Remove a child from the class if they continue being disruptive
- If the school feels the child's behaviour is really serious and it continues, then the school will have a meeting with the child's parents

What is the role of the adults in our school?

Governors

They ask the Head Teacher each term about any problems with behaviour and if there are any serious problems they will discuss this with the Head

Teacher and might sometimes attend meetings with the parents of children who are having problems with their behaviour.

The Head Teacher

The Head Teacher makes sure that everyone in school follows this policy and that any new adults coming to work at the school know about the policy. The Head Teacher makes sure that all the children in school know how to behave and that they follow the school code of conduct. It is the Head Teacher's job to make sure that all the children are safe in school.

All adults in school.

Everyone in school works hard to ensure that all the children follow the school code of conduct all the time. If children misbehave on more than one occasion, then their class teacher keeps a record of this and will talk to the Head teacher about this. This may be followed by meetings with parents.

Parents

The school works closely with parents and before their children start school they know about the school's expectations for behaviour. School asks parents to support the school in this policy and asks that they sign the home school agreement before their child starts school.

Children

All children are responsible for their own behaviour and we expect them to have a pride in the school, care for the other pupils and help to make it a safe and happy place to be.

This policy is agreed by the governors and is reviewed every year.
