Reception: Next week we will be continuing with our Gingerbread Man theme in Literacy and moving into 3D shape and pattern in Maths. Can we ask collect us some 3D shaped packaging/junk, thank you. Thanks to all for your fantastic support today for the cake sale/non-uniform day. Funds raised are for Cafod and we continue to learn about Cafod's 'Big Splash' next week, tying in with our RE theme of sharing drinks with the thirsty. Have a great weekend (looking for 2D and 3D shapes around you)! Thanks for your continued support.

Year 1: We have had a great first week back to this half term! The children have enjoyed being like the other classes and lining up with them in the morning, so thank you for your cooperation with this! In Maths the children are progressing well with their addition to 40 and in Literacy we have started our new story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. The children have enjoyed learning the actions for the story, and I am sure they would love to show you at home. In RE we have been thinking about Fairtrade and what impact it has on people around the world. We hope you have a lovely weekend!

Year 2: We have had a great start back after half term. In maths we are working with money making amounts in different ways and adding amounts to solve word problems. We will continue with this further next week looking at other problems finding change. In Literacy we are looking at story openers and characters linked to traditional tales. Our topic this half term is Castles and we have started our research about this using our own questions. In RE we are looking at Cafod linked to their theme this year 'Make a splash!' Please keep reading at home everyone this is really helping your children in not only reading but every area in class.

Year 3: Children have worked hard this week on their return to school after the half term break. We hope you all had a lovely time. We have begun to use our knowledge of news reports to write our own report about 'The Missing Gladiator' linking to our Roman topic. In Maths we have been focusing on multiplication. We have started a new Science topic this half term which looks at forces and magnets and we have finished off the week with the Cafod Fast Day. Thank you for your support with this.

Year 4: The children have worked hard this week. In Maths they have been working on their understanding of area and perimeter and how to calculate these. This coming week, we will be thinking about decimals, beginning with tenths and by the end of the week, moving on to hundredths. In Literacy, we continue with our work on writing instructions, thinking especially about how to make them effective for the reader. As part of our RE work, we have been thinking about 'Feeding the Hungry'. In our discussions, the children have talked about food banks. Because of this, I have arranged for us to go along to the food bank in Millom (While it is closed to the public) to learn about the work that is done there. The children will be bringing home a leaflet about the things which are welcomed at the food bank. It would be great if any items could be brought back into school this coming week and I will let you know when a definite visit has been arranged. Thanks for your help. Have a great weekend.

Year 5: It has been a very busy first week back for Year 5! On Monday we went to watch the St. Bernard's production of Grease. The children had a fantastic time and really enjoyed themselves. We even got to go up onstage and get a picture with the car: Greased Lightning! Tuesday saw the children take part in a Chinese dance workshop. Everyone got involved in the dancing and had a lot of fun. In maths we have started our new unit on time, timetables and graphs. You can support your child with this at home by helping and encouraging them to tell the time in both the 12-hour clock and the 24-hour clock. Next week we will be going on our school trip to Windermere. Please can I remind you to return the permission slip and money for the trip by Monday. I hope you have a lovely weekend!

Year 6: It's been lovely to see the children back after half term! The children have been learning how to calculate missing angles in triangles, quadrilaterals and other polygons in Maths. Next week we will be learning about BIDMAS, the conventions we use when carrying out different operations within a calculation. In Literacy, the children have been reading about the 'Snoozatron', an invention by Wallace and Gromit! They are now writing a persuasive advertisement for the contraption, which I am sure you will enjoy reading at parents evening (9th and 10th March). Next week, the children will be completing an art project with Mrs Marmion, linked to our RE work. Eight children from year 6 will be representing the school at the Young Voices concert in Manchester on Wednesday. I hope you all have a great weekend.

Last Week: Year 5 had a lovely trip to St Bernard's Catholic High School and really enjoyed watching the schools performance of Grease. On Tuesday we celebrated the Chinese New Year with some Dragon Dance workshops for all of the children. The whole school took part and the children had a great time watching and learning how to do

WEEK COMMENCING 29th FEBRUARY: We welcome Jasmine Heasley in to our school next week for her week long work experience. Jasmine will be working alongside our staff in class. We hope she enjoys her time with us. On Monday year 3 will be going to Mass at 9.30am, as always, parents, family and friends are very welcome to come and join us. On Tuesday, year 5 will be going to Windermere for a stone age experience! It sounds a really good day and we hope they all have an enjoyable time. The bus will return to school at about 4pm. On Wednesday, Mrs Orchard will be accompanying the children who are taking part in the Young Voices to the Manchester Arena. We hope you all have a brilliant day and enjoy the experience. On Friday Reception and Year 1 will be taking part in the Beebot Workshops. The children always enjoy this day and I'm sure this year will be no exception. Some of our year 5 children will be going to West Lakes Academy to take part in some playleader training, you will be getting letters home next week if your child is one of the children attending. Year 6 will be having a tag rugby session with Russell Gainford, please can all children remember to bring in their outdoor kits and trainers please.

PARENTS EVENINGS: Our Parents Evenings will be held on Wednesday 9th and Thursday 10th February, letters will be sent home on Monday and we would be grateful if you could fill in the appointment request form and send it back into school as soon as possible please.

IMPORTANT E-SAFETY: We have arranged for Jeff Haslam to come into school on Tuesday 22nd March to work with the children on the subject of E-Safety. He will also hold a parents meeting at 6pm that evening to give safeguarding advice to parents. We have had several instances of children coming into school having accessed unsuitable material at home without their parent's knowledge, this has caused upset and distress to the children, staff and parents. It is very important that parents do understand how they can prevent children from viewing sites that are unsuitable for children and Jeff will give you all the help and advice you need to help. The meeting won't be a long one but it will be full of very useful information and advice. Jeff will also answer any questions you may have about e-safety. We have run these sessions in the past but despite the importance of the subject and the effect it can have on children, we have not had a very good turn out. There are many, many new sites including social media sites that children do regularly access and these are full of hidden dangers that you should be aware of. I would urge you to please do come along to this meeting as I'm sure it will help you to safeguard your children. Thank you.

IMPORTANT: *Please can we ask you to check your children's heads thoroughly this weekend. We have had some instances of head lice in school this week so please do be vigilant. Lotion is no longer available from the Children's Centre. We have been advised to direct people to the Community Pharmacy Minor Ailment Scheme which is at either of the Chemists in Millom. If you do NOT normally pay a prescription charge, pharmacists will be able to provide you with advice and/or medicines for minor conditions free of charge.*

NO DOGS IN THE PLAYGROUND. THANK YOU: Can we please ask that you do not bring dogs into the playground when you are picking children up from school or dropping them off. Thank you.

ILLNESS: Please remember to ring into school in the morning if your child is absent, stating the nature of their illness. **Could we also remind you that if your child is absent due to sickness and / or diarrhoea, the recommended time they need to be absent from school is 48 hours from the last episode.** This is to help reduce the spread of infection. SCHOOL UNIFORM

Just a reminder of our official school uniform which should be worn by all pupils;

GIRLS UNIFORM: Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights.

BOYS UNIFORM: Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks.

All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather.

LABELS: All uniform should have your child's name on it. Please also label coats and pumps.

PE KITS

All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform.

PE KIT: White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps (not trainers).

If your child does not have their kit, they will not be able to do PE. This includes pumps or trainers. Thanks for your help with this.

EARRINGS: Please remove your child's earrings on their PE days. And also on Swimming days. They will not be allowed to take part in PE lessons if they are wearing their earrings. Thank you.

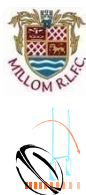

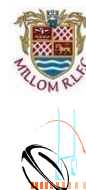
