Introduction

The Government believes that the Sport Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to improve the provision of Physical Education (P.E.) and sports in Primary Schools. This funding, provided jointly by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, is allocated to Primary Schools to improve their provision, providing them with the freedom to do this in a way that best suits the school and the needs of its pupils.

From September 2013 schools will be held to account over how they spend this funding. OFSTED will inspect the impact of the Sports Premium on the broader curriculum, both within and beyond the school day.
