## **Our Vision**

### **Fostering enquiring minds and reflective hearts**

Recognising its historic foundation, the School will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principals of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan levels.

The School aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.

### **Context of our school:**

Himbleton Church of England School is a smaller than average First school with Nursery, situated in the heart of one the smallest villages on the outskirts of Droitwich in Worcestershire. It is the only school in the village and is at the centre of the community. The Head teacher is new to the school having joined in April 2015, following the retirement of the previous long-serving head teacher who led the school for twenty years. Since taking over the Headship there has been some staff turnover amongst the teaching staff. There is no school hall. Nearly 70% of children come to the school from outside the catchment area.

## **OUR KEY SUMMARY OF PHYSICAL ACTIVITY USING OUR SPORTS PREMIUM FUNDING**

- At Himbleton we want all our children to enjoy healthy and fulfilling lives. We want all our children to enjoy participating in physical activities and understand its benefits. Without a school hall, it is important to embed 'outstanding' everyday practice.
- We encourage participation through:
  - Employing a qualified sports coach to lead games teaching across our school and co-ordinate development
  - Building the capacity of our teachers to deliver high quality games and PE lessons to develop skills and fitness
  - Developing a range of extra-curricular and lunchtime clubs around the school day
  - Developing Play Leaders and lunchtime supervisors plan a range of physical activities for children to enjoy at lunchtime
  - Taking opportunities across our curriculum for children to enjoy active and healthy activities
  - Being part of the Cluster Sports Events
  - Swimming is part of our curriculum from Year 2 upwards
  - Weekly Forest school activities for all children in EYFS and Year 1
  - Organising an annual School Games Sports Day allowing all children the opportunity to participate and compete against other children
- We also encourage high levels of participation in sports and competition through:
  - Delivery of a high quality games and PE curriculum where children regularly have the chance to participate and compete against one another in a competitive sporting environment
  - A range of sports clubs which include: football, basketball, gym dance etc
  - Excellence is achieved through supporting children to work with other sporting organisations through our Children's University and award schemes
  - Sports role models are invited into school to inspire children through demonstrations of their skills and through conversing with the children. These have included a local boating expert – Andy Train Olympic canonist, Worcester Warriors and Pershore Tennis Club.
- We celebrate all our childrens' sporting achievements through assemblies and make sure that keeping active and healthy remains central to our vision.
