What is the Sports Premium?

The Sports Premium is funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head Teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Purpose of the funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses of the funding could include:

- ↵ Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- ↵ New or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- ↵ Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/Sport
- ↵ Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/Sport
- ↵ Running sports competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- ↵ Buying quality assured professional development modules or material for PE/Sport

Key Objectives

At Livingstone we have identified the following key objectives in using the Sports Premium Grant is to improve the quality and breadth of P.E and sports provision by

- promoting physical activity as a healthy life style option,
- encouraging engagement in competitive sport
- establishing a focus on achievement outside the 'academic' subjects.
- Providing broader opportunities for all of our children

We firmly believe in living a healthy lifestyle with outdoor learning being a large part of this. We encourage all children to compete whatever their standard and to find their individual talents in order to become fit healthy adults.
