School Actions to follow:

- Progress measurements will be shared with parents when the new assessment criteria are sufficiently established to be able to make a fair judgement. The introduction of the new curriculum with higher expectations, new testing in KS1 and KS2 SATs based on moving away from levels and giving a scaled score which is no longer comparable to previous measurement of progress needs to be embedded.
- Parents have received 3 reports a year; one each term at Parents' Evening, with the annual report being presented at the end of the academic year. The annual report takes several hours to complete for each pupil. It would not be possible to provide this more than once a year. The interim reports Parents receive are based on their child's achievement in the term and sets targets to improve outcomes for their child.
- Homework has been reviewed and the new expectations are on our website under 'Curriculum', with extensions for those that are keen to do more.
- We will be running another Parent Workshop this year on 'Bullying' to help define the term and to share our 'Good Behaviour' Policy and the systems that we have in place in school.
