Dear Parents,

Please ensure your child's personal property especially P.E. Kit and Uniform are all labelled.

May we remind you that children are not allowed to wear jewellery or bring expensive items of any kind to school. Children are not allowed sweets, chocolates and chewing gums at school - and no high heels, sandals or fancy footwear. Only comfortable black shoes please.

We encourage children to respect school property. Children will be asked to pay for any books lost, whilst in their possession. They will also have to pay for any property damaged on purpose.

If your child attends an after school club, please ensure they are collected from school on time. If children are continually being picked up late from clubs they will be asked not to attend the club again.

Please ensure your child comes to school on time. Punctuality is a life-long habit which starts at primary school. The school bell goes promptly at 8.50am. Children need to be in school before the bell goes. If children are late they need to go to the school office to be marked in their class register and in the "late book". The late book is monitored regularly and strict procedures followed where punctuality is a concern. Children are NOT allowed any holidays during term-time.

Children should be collected from the playground after school at 3.20pm. Children, who are not collected by 3.30pm will pay a late charge of £5 and will be sent to the After School Club in the Dining Hall.

The After School Club can be used by working parents daily, on a regular basis, few days a week, in an emergency or on homework days. The After School Club finishes at 6 pm.

The Breakfast Club starts at 8.00 am. Please register your child/children if you think you might need to use the service:

Breakfast Club: £2 per day from 7:30am
After School Club: £5.00 per day till 6pm

As always children's' home language is considered very important and encouraged in the school. EAL (English as an additional language) teachers help us in this work. We are very fortunate that our EAL teachers and several other teachers can speak many of the community languages and can help parents by translating the information sent out by the school.
