Reception: The children have transitioned into school really well and are ready for starting full time next week! We have been very busy practicing our counting forwards and backwards to 10 and 20 and we have also started learning our first three sounds (s, a, and t). So next week the children will have their phonics home books sent home so that you can work with your child saying these sounds (with actions!) as well as practice writing them. Thank you to everyone for ordering your child's dinner online every day, it makes mornings a lot easier with this done at home! I hope you have a lovely weekend!

Year 1: This week we have been describing the star. We enjoyed making our own star using lots of sequins. We will continue with the book 'How To Catch A Star' next week and I have sent home a piece of homework related to the book; can it please be completed by Wednesday.

In maths we will be ordering numbers and creating fact posters about numbers. This week in phonics, Miss Carter's group have recapped s,a,t,p,i,n,m,d,g,o,ck and learnt the following tricky words, 'the' 'go' 'no' 'me' Mrs South's phonics group have learnt 'said' 'have' 'so' and 'do'.

Please can I remind you to continue reading with your child every day at home it will help them progress.

Year 2: Unfortunately at the time of print we do not have the year 2 newsletter item available. Mrs Carter will update our school facebook page to advise you of what is happening this coming week. Sorry for any inconvenience caused.

Year 3: What a busy week in Year 3! Unfortunately we had to postpone our Hodbarrow trip due to the weather. Fingers crossed for next week! Some children had a go at the trying out for our cross country team. If they weren't successful this time, there are always more opportunities. In Maths we have been working on adding tens and hundreds onto 3 digit number and completed the week with some column addition. In RE we have been thinking about baptism and we have asked the children if they have any photographs of their own baptism to share with us. Also on Monday, Year 3 will be attending Mass at 9am. Can we please ask that children are in school at 8:45 am and can come straight into class to get ready. We have also asked for contributions of cakes as we will be providing refreshments for the parishioners. Many thanks in advance for this – have a lovely weekend.

Year 4: It has been an exciting week in Year 4! The children took their instruments home for the first time on Monday and I know they have been very excited about sharing all they have learnt so far with you. On Friday we had a visit from Charlie Lupton for a World War Two workshop. The children had great fun and learnt a lot about the war which will help them in their topic work. In maths, we have finished our work on rounding and the children have some consolidation tasks to do on this for their homework. Next week we will move on to addition of numbers up to 10,000. The children have begun reading the books from the Year 4 reading list. I have stuck a table in the front of their homework book so that the children can record when they have finished reading a book and to write a comment about what they thought of each one they read. There is also a section for parents to sign to confirm that the children have read these books fully and understood what they have read. Please encourage them to take care of these books and to read them to you at home as well as their book band books. Year 4 afterschool games club will start again on Wednesday. I hope you all have a lovely weekend!

Year 5: The children have worked hard in school this week and have begun to write their own mystery stories which we will continue to work in his coming week. Maths has seen the children consolidate their understanding of rounding and their homework (p10) of their books will further reinforce this. Next week, we will be working with negative numbers. To help, the children could have a go at drawing some number lines and exploring what happens when numbers extend into the negative range. In RE, we will be thinking about how we can be stewards of the earth. We had a great afternoon on Thursday learning all about light and sound waves with the BAE roadshow. This coming week will also be busy with a trip to The Beggar's Theatre and on Wednesday, we will be enjoying a visit from The Magic Carpet theatre company. A quick reminder that children need to have pumps in school at all time. Thanks and have a great weekend!

Year 6: The children have been busy again this week. We have finished our suspense writing and will be learning more about journalistic writing next. In maths, we have spent the week consolidating addition and subtraction skills before moving onto multiplication and then division. On Thursday afternoon, the children enjoyed a visit from the BAE Roadshow. Next week is very busy. On Monday, the children are taking part in a pilgrimage at Lancaster Cathedral as part of the Year of Mercy and then on Tuesday, they will be returning to Lancaster to visit the Castle and find out more about crime and punishment to support our history topic. Please ensure that all permission slips have been returned for these two visits. On Friday, the children will be going to Millom School to watch a science show brought to Millom by the Science Museum in London; this will take place within the normal school day. I hope you all have a good weekend!

Sadly the football festival which was planned for Monday was cancelled due to the poor weather, we do not know if this will be rearranged in the future. Year 3's trip to Hodbarrow which should have taken place on Wednesday was also cancelled as it was far too windy. Our Parents Guild had their AGM on Tuesday evening, unfortunately no new parents came along and although the few remaining parents are going to try to carry on they desperately need help from others. They are arranging a Christmas Fair and some discos which I hope other parents will volunteer to help out with please. If you can help please contact our school office. On Thursday 29th year 5 and 6 enjoyed a workshop from BAE Systems which was all about light and sound waves. On Friday Year 4 had a great day with Charlie Lupton who brought his world war 2 workshop to school.

Week Commencing 3rd October:

Year 6 will be going to Lancaster on Monday 3rd as part of a pilgrimage for the Year of Mercy. The bus will be leaving school at 7.45am and should be back at school at about 5pm. Children will need to wear their school uniform and bring a packed lunch. Year 3 will be going to Mass on Monday at 9am. Year 3 will be providing refreshments for parishioners in The Columba Room afterwards, if any parents of year 3 children would like to contribute some cakes or biscuits towards this we would be very grateful. Please bring any donations to the office on Monday morning. If any parents or grandparents would like to join us at Mass you would be very welcome to come along. Years 3, 4 and 5 will be watching a performance of Bardolf's Box at The Beggars Theatre in the afternoon.

On Tuesday 4th year 6 will have another trip to Lancaster, this time to visit Lancaster Castle. The bus leaves school at 9.15am and should be back by the end of the school day. Again children need a packed lunch and wear school uniform. There is an inter school Cross Country competition planned for years 3, 4 and 5 on Tuesday. Children who are involved in this have had letters sent home from Mrs High. On Wednesday 5th we have a whole school performance of 'The Magic Circus' from the Magic Carpet Theatre Company. Please could we ask for a donation of **£1.50** per child to go towards the cost of this visit. Year 3 will hopefully be going to Hodbarrow in the afternoon, again this is weather permitting! Year 3 children will need to wear old clothes for this, not school uniform. On Friday 7th we have our Harvest Fast Day in aid of CAFOD. The theme this year is 'Brighten Up For Harvest' – we are planning to have a non-uniform day but would like the children to wear something bright please. Please could we ask for a donation of **£1** per child towards CAFOD. We are also having a cake sale and would like to ask if parents would donate cakes for us to sell to the children on the day please (brightly coloured cakes would be brilliant!). Children can bring money in and are able to buy cakes during the morning break. Any left over cakes are sold to parents after school. Please do support our fund raising effort for CAFOD. Many thanks.

There is a nasty sickness bug going around at the moment which has resulted in one of the schools in our area having to close for a couple of days. We have had several cases of this on Friday and we would just like to remind parents of the advice concerning sickness and diarrhoea bugs. **Please do not send your child in to school if they have been vomiting or had diarrhoea. They need to be kept at home for 48 hours after the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea. Could you also remember to contact school to let us know that your child is off ill please.** Many thanks for your help.

SCHOOL UNIFORM: Just a reminder of our official school uniform which should be worn by all pupils;

GIRLS UNIFORM: Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights. Summer Uniform is pink school dress with white socks, white sandals may be worn.

BOYS UNIFORM: Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks.

All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather.

LABELS: All uniform should have your child's name on it. Please also label coats and pumps.

PE KITS: All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform.

PE KIT: White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps.

If your child does not have their kit, they will not be able to do PE. This includes pumps or trainers. Thanks for your help with this.

EARRINGS

Please remove your child's earrings on PE days. And also on Swimming days. Children will not be allowed to take part in PE lessons if they are wearing their earrings. Our school policy is that staff do not remove earrings for the children and that a plaster covering the earring is not sufficient. Thank you.
