For children who can already swim, learn a range of different strokes. Due to location of school, near the beach, perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.</li> <li>b) Staff will deliver a series of quality lessons to ensure coverage of the curriculum. The new scheme will bring fresh ideas.</li> <li>c) Children access a range of clubs locally to increase their fitness, resilience and commitment.</li> <li>d) Children become further skilled at skipping.
