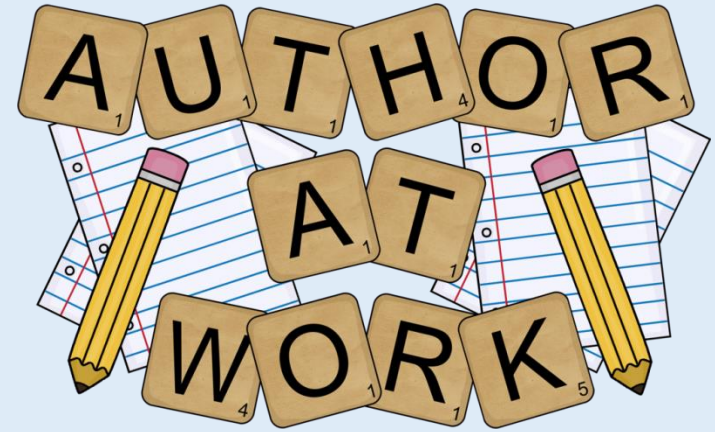


# Expectations for children in Year 5 and 6

Expectations and standards have increased. Expected standard is more old level 5





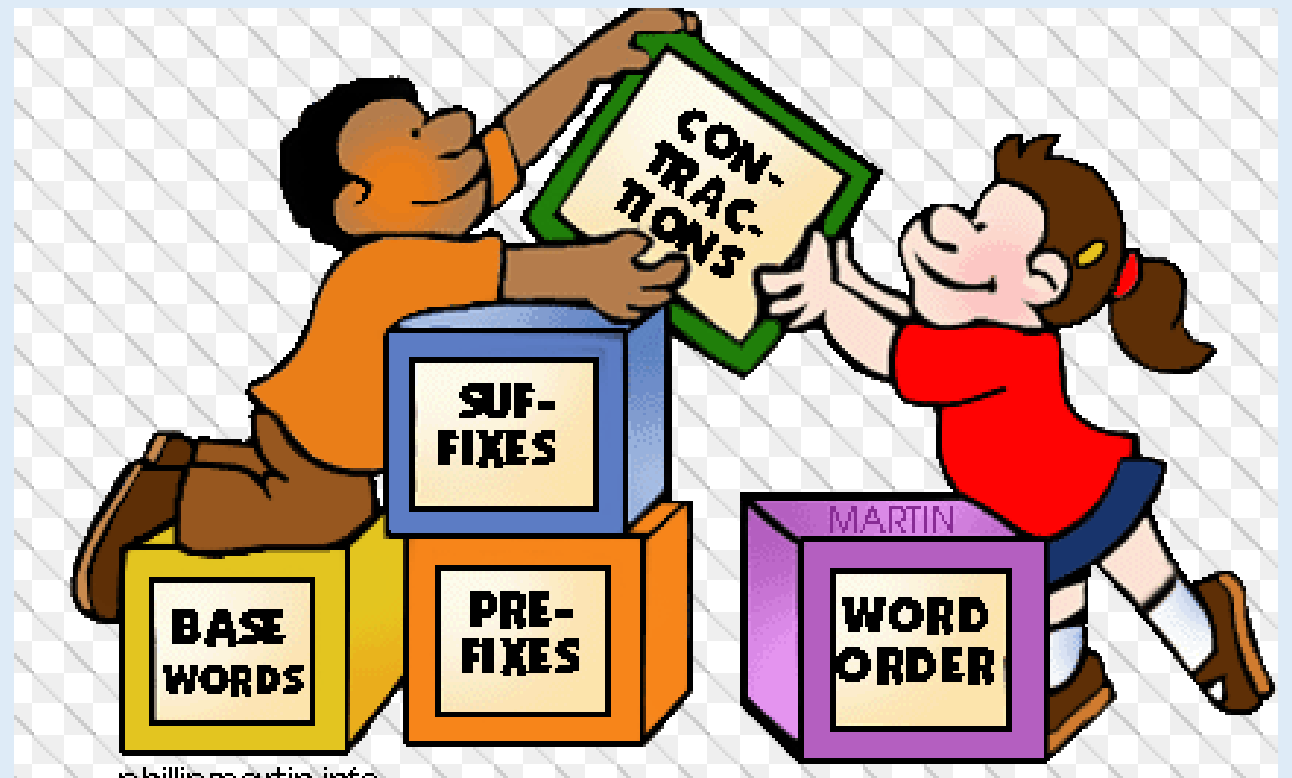
- Spelling- year 3/4 5/6 common exception words

## How do the children meet expected standard?

- We assess children's independent writing against the criteria twice every half term.

## Interim teacher assessment framework at the end of key stage 2 - reading

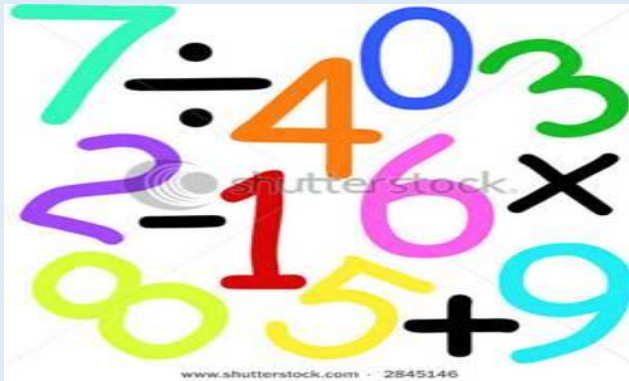
### Working at the expected standard

The pupil can:

- read age-appropriate books with confidence and fluency (including whole novels)
- read aloud with intonation that shows understanding
- work out the meaning of words from the context
- explain and discuss their understanding of what they have read, drawing inferences and justifying these with evidence
- predict what might happen from details stated and implied
- retrieve information from non-fiction
- summarise main ideas, identifying key details and using quotations for illustration
- evaluate how authors use language, including figurative language, considering the impact on the reader
- make comparisons within and across books.



<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>•read, write, order and compare numbers up to 1 000 000 and determine the value of each digit</li><li>•round any number up to 1 000 000 to the nearest 10, 100, 1000, 10 000 and 100 000</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>•read, write, order and compare numbers up to 10 000 000 and determine the value of each digit</li><li>•round any whole number to a required degree of accuracy</li></ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>•read Roman numerals to 1000 (M) and recognise years written in Roman numerals</li><li>•recognise and use square numbers and cube numbers, and the notation for squared (<math>^2</math>) and cubed (<math>^3</math>)</li></ul>
