**Reception:** We have had a great start back at school this week! We have been celebrating 'Room on the Broom' week, where we have been making wands, brooms, and acting out the story. The children have really enjoyed it! In Maths, we have been looking at numbers that can make 10 and also one more/one less. Please could you practice counting forwards and backwards with your child up to 20, this will really help them with our maths jobs. In RE we have been thinking about families and how we are part of a school family as well as God's family! Thank you for all the hamper donations that have been sent into school – we really appreciate them. Have a lovely weekend! **(Phonic sounds taught this week: o, c, k, ck. Tricky words: I, me, my).** **Class Hampers:** *The Parents Guild have asked us to make some Hampers to raffle at the Christmas Fair they have given each class a different theme for their hamper and we would be grateful for donations for our hamper. Our theme is: Cinema / Movie Night.*

**Year 1:** We have had a great start back this week! We have enjoyed our 'twinkle twinkle little star' week and created some lovely nursery rhymes; they are now on display in our class book! We have been looking at counting on from a given number to solve addition number sentences in maths. I have sent some home for homework to help secure the children's knowledge of this. In RE we have been thinking about Noah's ark and promises; we have made our own rainbow promises too. Phonic sounds covered this week: Miss Carter – ay ea i3. **Class Hampers:** *The Parents Guild have asked us to make some Hampers to raffle at the Christmas Fair they have given each class a different theme for their hamper and we would be grateful for donations for our hamper. **Year 2:** We have had a very busy week for our first week back. In maths we are continuing adding two digit numbers in different ways and it would help if you can practice this at home. In Literacy we have started a new text 'The Bird in the Forest' which will continue this half term as our Talk for Writing text. The children all enjoyed the play in a day yesterday and have remembered lots of the facts. We used this work to start our new topic books. In RE our topic this half term is Mysteries which will link into the Nativity story as the term progresses. Please keep up the daily reading practice as this is helping the fluency as the children need to be able to read 90 words a minute fluently by the end of the Year. I will send some homework home during the week when we have completed some more of our maths work. **Class Hampers:** *The Parents Guild have asked us to make some Hampers to raffle at the Christmas Fair they have given each class a different theme for their hamper and we would be grateful for donations for our hamper. **Year 3:** Welcome back after the half term break! We hope you all had a lovely time with your children. This week we are continuing with our subtraction in maths and have started a new unit in Literacy – using the story of 'St. George and the Dragon' to look at tales of defeating the monster. This week we have looked at using expanded noun phrases to make our writing as interesting and descriptive as possible. For homework, children have some new spellings and a reading comprehension about Bonfire Night as well as some Maths. For the reading comprehension, if the reading is too difficult for your child to manage on their own, as always, please support and help them to do this. Working together is fine! Finally, we are collecting items for a **Class Hamper** to be won at the Christmas fair on the 27<sup>th</sup> November. Our theme is 'Around the World' and any donations would be greatly received. **Year 4:** It has been a great week back to school for Year 4! On Tuesday we went to Tullie House in Carlisle for our school trip. The children had a brilliant time dressing up as evacuees and investigating what life was like during World War Two – I'm sure they had lots to tell you. In literacy we began a new unit of work on writing a tale of fear and we have been looking at the story *The Nightmare Man* to help us. In maths we started looking at subtraction and, so far, the children have grasped this well. We will move on to thinking about word problems involving both addition and subtraction next week. The Parent's Guild has asked us to create a **Class Hamper** to raffle at the Christmas Fair. The theme for Year 4 this year is 'Arts and Crafts'. Any donations of items based on this theme would be greatly appreciated. I hope you all have a lovely weekend!

**Year 5:** The children have made a great start back after the half term and have worked really hard this week. Well done to the children who took part in Cyclewise this week; the feedback about them was great! In Maths, the children have worked hard to develop their subtraction skills and next week we will be moving on to solving problems with more than one step. In Literacy, we will be looking at our learnt text about alien invasions and changing details to make it our own. In RE, we will be thinking about God's covenants; we will begin this learning by learning what a covenant is. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights.
